Highway Marker Will Rise at Old Applegate Home



A permanent marker off the highway at the old Jesse Applegate homestead at Yoncalla, will be erected by the Old Oregon Trail Association. It was announced by Walter Meacham, executive secretary, at Portland.

The marker will be a large boulder of eight or 10 tons weight, standing six or more feet in height. In it will be set a bronze plaque reciting briefly the history of the Applegate brothers, Jesse, Lindsay, and Charles.

The State Highway Commission has promised to fix a turnout and prepare the base for the marker, Meacham said.

The old tombstone, pictured above and made of slate, standing over Jesse's grave, is peeling off, and the association hopes to place a new one there.

J. H. Booth, vice president of the United States National Bank at Roseburg, has been appointed treasurer of the Applegate fund, and will receive contribution from the general public as well as from descendants of the Applegate families, who wish to participate in the projects, Meacham said.

Unveiling ceremony for the marker will be sometime in September.

Dike Across Tributary Of Smith River Planned

Intentions to construct a levee or dike across Otter Slough, a tributary of Smith River, as a part of the program for improvement of the river channel in connection with recently authorized navigation and flood control betterment, are announced by the Army Engineers. The dike will permanently block the slough to navigation.

The Douglas county court has agreed to construct access roads across the proposed dike to provide an outlet for areas which would be otherwise isolated by the slough closure.
