The artist John Mills' famous painting of Christ in the carpenter shop and home of his parents aptly pictures the words of Ezekiel: "What are these wounds in thine hands." In the center of the group, is Jesus with wounded hands, over which Mary, his mother bends in loving solicitude. At the right is John with a basin of water and through the doorway, we see the hillside with its sheep. The wounds in the hands of the Christ remind us that Christianity is a sacrificial religion. They are symbolic of a crucified service. The silent opposition of His kindly was harder to bear because there was no hatred in it, but rather love. His wounds were inflicted by the insincerity and indifference of the self-righteous; by the intolerance and inconsistency of the people of his own nationality and today civilization is party to this great outrage. Those hands that blessed and comforted. Yet, were blood-stained and torn for us. Can it be that we would again wound those hands that were wounded for us.

**Search For Crash Victim Launched in Douglas-Coos Area**

An intensive search for Sgt. Robert Neal, radio operator of the Army C-46 transport plane which crashed last November in the rugged mountainous area between Coos and Douglas Counties, was made by his father, William Neal of Los Angeles, last week.

Neal, accompanied by Harold Noah, trapper and woodsman, searched out streams in the Pleasant, Lake and Bear Creek areas hoping that lower water in the streams might reveal the body caught in brush or log piles that were under water most of the time since the crash.

A further search will be made of the Loon Lake area on the Umpqua side of the mountains, Neal said.

Sgt. Neal was variously reported to have been the fourth man to jump and to have still been in the plane when it crashed. Not a trace of him or his possessions has been found.
