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Record Crops Promise Return to Whiter Bread

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bushels were produced.

The wheat crop is expected to hit a new top of 1,132,075,000 bushels compared with a record of 1945 output of 1,123,143,000 bushels.

On the basis of prospects two weeks ago the figures meant an indicated improvement in the corn crop of about 146,000,000 bushels and of 42,000,000 in wheat.

"Ify" Questions Posed

With OPA's future still uncertain, the Agriculture Department official said no decisions had been reached on relief buying.

"However, if price controls go back on grain within the next few weeks, the set-aside (for government buying) probably will be reinstated and the government will pay up to the ceiling price even though it is higher than what existed June 30.

"In that case, it would decide whether grain handlers would have to set-aside for the government 50 per cent of the wheat they handled as previously or a revised figure.

"As far as meat purchasers are concerned, there is some feeling that the department will not go back into the market even if controls are reestablished, except possibly to buy for UNRRA. The assumption is that foreign nations could do as well for themselves by buying direct from the packers.

levy, Judge Busenbark said, will be 8.5 mills against property evaluations of \$36,504,980, compared with the 1945-46 tax levy of 8.3 mills against \$35,333,615. Property evaluations this year show an increase of \$1,170,665.

Before the budget reaches the stage of final adoption, Judge Busenbark said, he hopes the district attorney, to whom the matter has been referred, will interpret the budget law's intent to mean that the county court may amend or change the budget following the expression of public will at a public hearing.

Need Is Emphasized

The county court was told at yesterday's hearing that the sanitarian is needed for the correction of sorely-neglected sanitary conditions throughout the county. His duties, it was pointed out, require a person qualified by the proper training, which the present staff of the county health office lacks.

Added duties, including the inspection and grading of all restaurants and eating places in the county, have been thrust by law into the hands of the county health officer.

Arthur R. Marsh, chairman of the budget committee, was assured by Dr. E. J. Wainwright, county health officer, that the sanitarian would be under the health department, and his appointment would not be the creation of a new county department with its attendant expenses and overhead.

Dr. Wainwright said he had contacted the other members of the budget committee, C. R. Elliott of Reedsport and Huron W. Clough of Canyonville. Elliott told Dr. Wainwright that he did not know too much about the matter of a sanitarian, while Clough was seemingly opposed to the proposal.

Resentment of both Arab and Jewish communities rose noticeably following publication in the Palestine Post of the names of Arabs and Jews who were killed. The crazed calculations of men who have broken with their cause have weighted the air with horror," said the Post, which is the voice of official Zionism.

LONDON July 23.—(P)—Prime Minister Attlee told the House of Commons today that, "of all the outrages in Palestine, many and horrible in the past few months," the blasting of the King David hotel in Jerusalem yesterday was the worst.

"As this house knows," Attlee continued, "his majesty's government are at this moment in consultation with the government of the United States with a view to arriving at proposals for a just settlement of the Palestine problem, which will be placed before the representatives of both Arabs and Jews."

"His majesty's government has stated and stated again that they will not be diverted by acts of violence in their search for a just and final solution of this problem."
