Oregon's Higher Education Board Members Retained

PORTLAND, July 24.—(AP)—All present officers of the State Board of Higher Education were re-elected for another year here yesterday at the regular July meeting devoted also to adoption of the biennial budget pattern and numerous building and personnel matters preparatory to record campus enrollments this fall.

Willard L. Marks, president; Mrs. Beatrice Walton Sackett, vice-president, and Edgar W. Smith as third member of the executive committee were continued without opposition.

This was the first meeting for the newly appointed member, Mrs. E. B. MacNaughton, Portland, succeeding R. C. Greenbeck, Klamath Falls, resigned. It was also the first meeting since the retirement of Dr. F. M. Hunter as chancellor. President Marks gave the following statement to the press in explanation of the present interim arrangement:

"Dr. F. M. Hunter retired from the office of chancellor on July 1 as he had requested at the March meeting of the board, which request was approved at that time.

"Beginning July 1, Dr. C. D. Byrne, executive secretary of the State Board of Higher Education for the past 13 years, was designated by the board as liaison officer.

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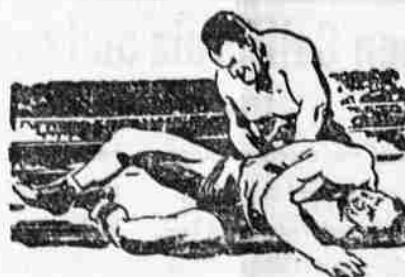

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cer, with all recommendations from the institutional executives passing through his office to the board.

"Dr. Byrne is serving as administrator of all centralized activities and of the board's centralized offices, until such time as permanent arrangements are made. He is also acting as presiding officer of a council of institutional executives for consideration of major policies. Complete administration of the separate institutions is in the hands of their respective executives.

"This arrangement will remain in effect until such time as the board reaches a decision with respect to a chancellor. While a survey of men to fill this position has been under way for several months, the board desires to take whatever time is necessary for such an important position."
