

'Caste System' in U. S. Described by Russian Writer

MOSCOW, July 25.—(AP)—The Russian reporter Ilya Ehrenburg wrote in Izvestia "yesterday that the United States had a legalized racial caste system in the case of Negroes and an entirely unofficial racial caste system in the treatment of Jews, Italians and Chinese."

Ehrenburg has just returned from an extensive, unrestricted tour of the United States.

"America, which never knew feudalism, has established another hierarchy—a racial one," he wrote.

"The English, Scotch and Irish are the aristocracy. After them come the Scandinavians and Germans, and then the French and Slavs. The Italians are many times lower. The Jews are even lower. Puerto Ricans are below them and the last at the bottom of the ladder are the Negroes."

Ehrenburg said the United States to him was a "puzzling place which helped to defeat Hitlerism, but which takes anti-Semitism as a natural phenomenon and deprives Negroes of all human rights."

He said that if a man had a "colored" grandfather, he was regarded as "colored" and forced to submit to various restrictions.

At Nashville, Tenn., the reporter said an unidentified man tried at length to convince him there were lower and higher races, repeating "all the theories of Rosenberg and other ideologists of the Third Reich."

Hay Fever Club Looks to Congress To War on Weeds

KANSAS CITY.—Thousands of Americans are girding themselves for a mighty "Ah-Choo."

"At 2 P. M. on August 15 it begins in earnest," solemnly predicts the president of the Heart of America Hay Fever Club, Dr. D. M. Nigro.

Over a carefully-chosen lunch minus pork and corn on the cob (a dietary slip once caused him to sneeze 25 times before he could get to sleep), the Hay Fever Club president and founder bemoaned the lack of national legislation to fight the hay fever scourge.

Cites Economics Waste

"People spend millions of dol-

lars every year going to different climates for relief from hay fever," he said. "That money should be spent for preventive measures."

The "cures" that come out every spring? "Oh, I've got an office full of 'em," the genial doctor remarked. "What helps one won't do a bit of good for the next one. About the best remedy they've discovered so far is a change of climate and a regulated diet."

Now if Congress had just taken the advice of the Hay Fever Club back in the days of the WPA, reminisced Dr. Nigro, there might be a lot less sneezing going on today. At its annual convention some ten years ago, club members voted to write, Harry Truman, then senator from Missouri, to ask that the WPA be put to work tearing up ragweed, pig weed and timothy by the roots. That, quipped the doctor, would really get at the root of the hay fever cause.

Margaret Sneezes, Too

But though Mr. Truman wrote in hearty approval of the plan (his daughter, Margaret, suffers from hay fever too), nothing was done about it.

The only qualification for membership in the club is Hay Fever. There are no dues. Your only obligation is to write your congressman regularly and remind him of the need for a national hay fever program for his sneezing constituents.

Dr. Nigro founded the club in 1922 from among patients and friends who suffered from hay fever. He estimates 3,000 are

now on the club's mailing list. This year's club convention will be held in August, "probably in Colorado Springs." It will be a five-day affair, with 200 to 300 members expected. The business meetings do get a little noisy, Dr. Nigro admitted, what with all the sneezing.
