First Sacker Of Chiefs Rates Tops As Utility Player

Twenty-two-year-old Dick DeBernardi, Umpqua Chief first sacker, may be the youngster of the club, but his ability has made up for his age with every club he's participated with in the national pastime.

An ex-Navy chief, DeBernardi returned to Roseburg last winter to take up his ball playing after four years' lapse. He began playing in this city when 14 years old with the Junior Legion team at centerfield and has since played at every position on the field, thus earning him the title of not only the Chiefs' stalwart first baseman, but also a valuable utility man.

Moved to the mound by both high school and Junior Legion coaches in 1940, DeBernardi won a total of 16 out of 19 games with six shutouts and two no-hits, no-runners, for an average of 10 strikeouts per game.

Enlisting at 18, he immediately was placed on the Seattle Naval Air Station nine at the keystone infield position, playing with Johnny Heller, Hollywood Stars' hurler, and Chief McCormick of the Spokane Indians as teammates. It was while he was with this club he played against his present Chiefs teammate Vonnie Baker, then with the McCord Field AAF nine.

Following 27 months of Pacific duty, young DeBernardi was promoted to the rank of chief petty officer and won a berth on the San Diego Air Station club as first baseman. Notables on that same lineup and worthy teachers of DeBernardi were Wally Berger of Detroit Tiger fame, Ray Alderson, Chicago Cubs, and Les Minor of the Philadelphia Athletics.

A discharge followed an undefeated baseball season at San Diego and he returned to Roseburg and joined the Umpqua Chiefs to prove himself outstanding on the first-post spot. In this season's play he has but one error in his play he has but one error in a little better than a hit per game.

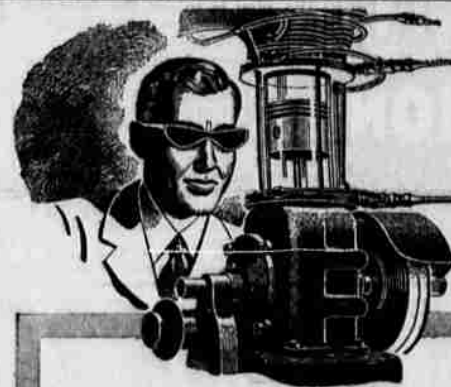
