

W. L. Giles' Body Will Be Taken to Wyoming for Rites

The body of William Lamar Giles, 43, who was killed Tuesday while working in the Fiddle Lumber and Manufacturing Co. logging woods near Milo, is to be taken to Jackson, Wyo., for funeral services and interment, it was announced today by the Douglas Funeral Home, which is in charge of local arrangements.

Born July 30, 1903, at Springville, Utah, Mr. Giles spent the greater part of his life in Wyoming, where he was married, Oct. 1, 1930, to Grace Dornrose. Before coming to Oregon in May, 1945, Mr. and Mrs. Giles spent a year and a half in Nevada, and made their home in Dorris, Calif., for three years. They had resided in the Tiller-Milo community since arriving in Oregon.

Housing Sought For New Roseburg School Teachers

Housing for several new faculty members of the Roseburg schools is the problem of Superintendent Paul S. Elliott, who has three couples and five or six single girls wanting places to live, he said today.

Among the new teachers is John Newby, formerly of Bend, Ore., who will come here as basketball and track coach and instructor in social science classes. He is staying temporarily at the home of Ormer J. Monger, high school principal.

Expected here next week are Mr. and Mrs. Roy E. Crain, who will both teach at Benson School. Mr. Crain will take over the principalship and Mrs. Crain is expected to teach the fourth grade. They are graduates of Colorado State College at Greeley, and formerly resided at La Junta, Colo.

Mr. and Mrs. Leonard Kimbrell are coming here after his three-and-a-half years in the Army. He will teach English and art classes at the Senior High School. They are graduates of Louisiana Northwestern State College.

Elliott is trying to locate an instructor for girls' physical education classes at the high school, and one or two elementary teachers, he said. Also, he can employ two women to work half-time as custodians at the Junior and Senior High Schools.

Lack of Housing Will Reject Many At Oregon Colleges

Prospective students at Oregon colleges and universities may be on tenterhooks until the last minute, not certain whether they will be able to enter the school of their choice.

The reason is the tremendous increase of those who plan to enter college and the lack of housing for them.

Virtually all Oregon institutions are confronted by the same problem, but because they attract the greatest number the University of Oregon and Oregon State College have it in the most acute form.

At the University, high academic standards have been set. Out-of-state students are required to have higher qualifications than those from Oregon. This, however has only lessened the problem; not solved it.

Must Provide Own Housing

After clearing students academically, Clifford Constance, assistant to the registrar, reported, university-controlled housing was allocated to them on the basis of priority of applications. When the available housing was filled—and it was some time ago—the university gave qualified acceptance to those meeting the academic standards. If they can show that they can provide their own housing—with relatives, in rooming houses or otherwise—they will be accepted. If not, the university will not be open to them this fall.

Veterans, whose return to the classrooms has caused much of the problem, were given priority on new housing installed on the campus. It will accommodate about 1,000, including 200 to 300 married veterans.

At Oregon State College the picture is somewhat different. There is no requirement for advance registration as at the university. If someone—if an Oregon resident—shows up on opening day and has housing, he will be admitted if he meets entrance requirements. E. B. Lemon, dean of administration, reports, However, the likelihood of that

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happening is remote, for Corvallis is jammed to the rafters. As a matter of fact, some 8,000 applications for fall enrollment already exceed by 1,500 to 2,000 the number that can be accommodated. All college-controlled living quarters are filled.

Every effort, Lemon said, will be made to place veterans but there is a serious question whether any more can be accepted unless they rustle up their own housing. Out-of-state veterans cannot be given priority of any kind, he said, if Oregon students are to be accommodated.

Authorities are urging those who do not now have assurance of a place to live to attend one of the other institutions in the state. Many of them also are at or near their maximum capacities, but some, such as Vanport at Portland, can still take reservations.

Many prospective students may find themselves without a school or attending one they didn't pick in the first place. But officials, who have been sending the summer seeking a solution say there is no help for it; there's just not enough housing for everyone.
