British, U. S. in Clash Over Derelict Vessel

mirally said it thought the message referred to the British merchant marine flag and not the Union Jack.

The Farmer carried \$2,000,000 worth of wheat and dried eggs for England and London papers estimated the ship was worth \$2,500,000 additional.

British Press Bitter

The U. S. Navy said its only interest was in getting the crippled ship to port. A spokesman said that for the pint-sized Elizabeth to tow the Farmer to port would have been "like an ant towing a grasshopper." The Elizabeth has a three-cylinder steam engine and was bound from Nova Scotia with a cargo of nine timber.

A spokesman for the U. S. Lines said:

"British papers are fairly crucifying us on hearsay." He said he was incensed particularly by a Daily Mail headline which said: "Americans Seized Prize Ship from Britons—Ensign Hauled Down After 16-Hour Tow." The Star bannered "Food Ship Sailing Into War." Lord Beaverbrook's Evening Standard headlined "Ministry Told Our Flag Hauled Down."

A United States Line official said its information indicated that the matter of salvaging the American Farmer had been "worked out in the best interests of the damaged ship" by those at the scene.

The U. S. Navy said all the ships involved in the incident were merchant ships except the U. S. destroyer, which was dispatched to "preserve life and assist in any rescue efforts." The U. S. Navy declined comment on the salvage dispute.

Insane Marine Killed After He Slays Comrade

TIENTSIN, Aug. 5.—(AP)—A mentally deranged American marine, shot and killed a marine sentry and a Chinese military policeman before he was killed yesterday in a running street fight, marine corps headquarters announced today.

Several military policemen and Chinese pedestrians were wounded. Authorities withheld identities of the two marines pending notification of next of kin.
