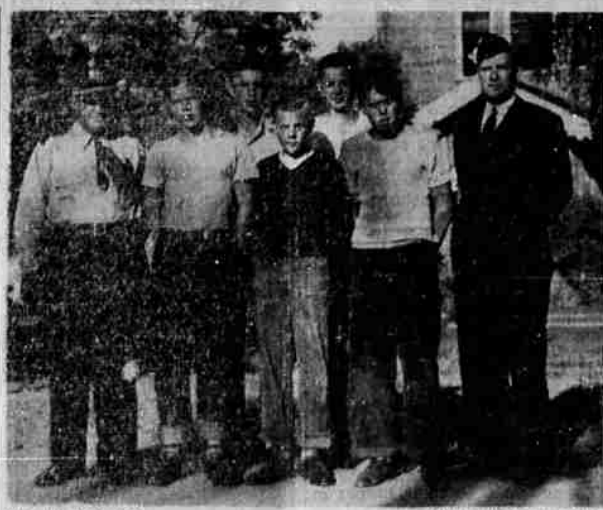

## CAMP FIRE COUNCIL FAVORS CONSTRUCTION OF SWIMMING POOL AND PARKS

At a recent meeting of the Roseburg Camp Fire Council, Mrs. Walter Allen (Betty Shoemaker), was employed as part-time executive secretary to take over duties now performed by the president and other council members although they will retain their offices. Camp Fire program has been extended and grown so in the past few years that the council feels justified in taking this action.

Mrs. Allen is well qualified for the position, being a former Camp Fire girl herself. She has attended various camps and taken numerous training courses and at one time was director of a local camp. She will endeavor to conduct training courses for local guardians some time this fall.

The council went on record as favoring immediate steps toward construction of a swimming pool in Roseburg as soon as materials are available. Since some funds are already on hand for this purpose, it is felt by the council that this matter should not be further delayed. Since swimming in the South Umpqua is well endeavoring after the water reaches such a low stage as at present, the pool

is vitally needed to carry on work so ably started by Red Cross and Recreation programs.

At a previous meeting the council passed a resolution stating the need for a park or parks in Roseburg. The city owned "so called" park in Laurelwood was cited as an example of an easily developed natural park. The contour of the land is ideally and naturally suited for park purposes and is partially covered with Madrone trees. The group went on record as favoring development of this site for park purposes. Throughout the city are other places that should be developed in a like manner.

## Smith River Falls Ladder Completed

REEDSPORT—A fish ladder at Smith River Falls, a project started in 1938, was finally completed last week when H. C. Warren, state fish commission engineer, announced the completion of the job under joint operation of the state biological survey, the state game and state fish commissions.

It was finally decided that five-foot walls or divisions will be sufficient to allow the game fish to advance over the falls to the spawning grounds. After two poles were blasted, one near the foot, the other near the top of the falls, the steps were cemented by a crew of four men who completed the job in six days.

An intensive study of conditions at the falls showed that silversides and chinook can easily jump the five-foot wall and that chubs and other scrap fish cannot make the grade.

Sports fishermen of this section are reported to be delighted with the finished product and it is believed that the ladder will improve the Smith River as a sportsman paradise.

Local reports show that the chinook which have been milling

outside the mouth of the Umpqua are becoming more restless for their trek to the upper reaches of the Umpqua spawning grounds.

## New Fishing Boat Bows At Winchester Bay

REEDSPORT—Another fine, home-built outside fishing boat took the water at Winchester Bay last week, when the Christina J. slid down the ways into the bay. The vessel is the handiwork of Victor Carlson, his son, Ted, and his son-in-law, Bud Boyes.

The three owners will, as soon as the boat is completely outfitted, operate it as an outside fishing boat. All three men are experienced fishermen and have spent the last three months in the construction of this sleek, V-bottom fishing craft.
