MURRAY, Utah, Aug. 15.—(AP)—Mrs. Cecile Dempsey, 87, the mother of former heavyweight boxing champion Jack Dempsey, died at her home here today.

The former heavyweight champion was at the bedside when his mother passed away.

Mrs. Dempsey was born at Logan, W. Va., April 4, 1859, and moved to Manassa, Colo., where Jack was born, about 1890.

Besides Jack, a daughter, Miss Tisde Dempsey and another son, Joe, survive.

Mrs. Dempsey's former husband, Bernard Dempsey, lives at South Salt Lake, Utah.

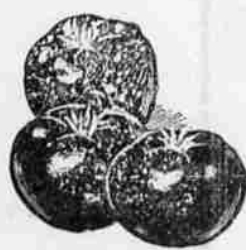

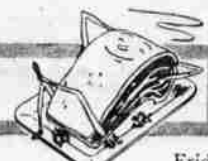

Spread in paper lined pan, 8x8.

2 tbsp. light corn syrup
1 tsp. grated orange rind
1/4 tsp. salt
