

Rainbows Beaten In Opener, 7 to 5, By Cottage Grove

Roseburg's Rainbow Grill, playing at Cottage Grove in District No. 15 softball eliminations, as a part of the state title series, dropped the first game of their three-game schedule last night, 7 to 5. Leading 5 to 4 in the sixth inning, the Rainbows blew the game in the last half of that frame, when Sandstead temporarily lost his control, walking two batters and yielding two hits.

The Rainbows went into an early lead, scoring two runs on hits by Baughman, Debernardi and Boucek. Cottage Grove scoring one run in their half of the inning as the result of two walks.

The Rainbows added another in the second, when Aterbury led off with a single, advanced on two infield outs, and scored on a single by Ridge.

Cottage Grove tied the score with two runs in the last of the second on hits by Owen, Leach and Sauter, Leach hitting a triple, and Sauter a two-bagger.

Single tallies in the third and fourth innings put the Rainbows out in front, with Cottage Grove adding one in the fourth.

In the last of the sixth, Leach, first Cottage Grove batter at the plate, grounded out pitcher to first. McKibben walked. Hockes fanned. Roland walked. Sauter singled to score McKibben, and Elting drove in Roland and Sauter with a lousy double.

Baughman connected for a single in the seventh inning, but the Rainbows could not get their usual last-inning rally rolling.

Jewish Strike Will Protest Deportations

ing to deport the immigrants.

Tension was reported running high in Haifa, although no curfew has been claimed on the town as yet. High police officials, including the inspector general, conferred with local police leaders.

Retaliation Expected

After yesterday's sentencing to death of 18 alleged members of the so-called Stern gang, for a bomb raid on Haifa railway shops, rumors spread that the underground would strike back and the reports of renewed deportations added to the apprehension of authorities.

Latest reports indicated the Vaad Leumi (national council for Palestine Jews) was standing pat on its decision for a non-cooperation strike tomorrow to protest the deportations.

In Paris David Ben-Gurion, chairman of the Jewish agency executive, said last night that President Truman's statement that he is considering asking congress for special legislation to permit entry to the U. S. of some European refugees including Jews, "doesn't alter the Palestine situation at all."

"If America would admit some European refugees it would be a fine thing. But there are 500,000 Jews in Europe who must leave and the majority of them want to go to Palestine."

In London the Times hailed Truman's statement as a "courageous decision," while the other morning papers made no editorial comment.
