To tighten the bond of co-operative relations between home and school, a three-week course in "Parent-Teacher Leadership" will be held between August 5 and 24 at Northwestern University, Evanston, Ill., under the joint sponsorship of the university and the National Congress of Parents and Teachers.

Teachers, school administrators and college faculty members from every section of the country will be present for the accredited course, the first of its kind ever sponsored by the national congress. The class will include not only graduate students regularly enrolled in the Northwestern summer session, but also a score of professional educators who have been awarded scholarships of the national congress and various state branches.

The course has been designed to meet both immediate and long-range objectives. Teachers and school administrators in the class will learn the most effective ways of using the PTA as a unifying force in the all-around development of today's children. The visiting college faculty members will incorporate information on the parent-teacher movement in their own teacher-training courses as a means of preparing

prospective teachers for successful service in tomorrow's school-rooms.

Class discussions and work-day problems involved in home-shop investigations of the every-school-community co-operation will be led by a faculty of specialists in the fields of education, child development and parent-teacher activity. Mrs. Eva Grant, editor of "National Parent-Teacher" the PTA Magazine, will be co-ordinator for the course.

Roseburg Church Benefits From Will of Mrs. Barry

PORTLAND, Ore., Aug. 19.—(AP)—The estate of Miss Winifred Barry, former resident of Roseburg, who died in Portland July 11, amounts to \$14,761, according to an inventory filed in circuit court. W. D. Hinson, trust officer of the United States National Bank, is executor. The estate consists mostly of real property. Under terms of the will, Miss Barry bequeathed \$1,000 to the Catholic Church in Roseburg, \$2,000 to Archbishop Edward D. Howard, Portland, to be used to train Catholic priests; \$5,000 to her niece, Mrs. Alice Sloan Meagher, Portland; \$1,000 each to granddaughters, Mrs. A. W. Swartz, Winifred Meagher, Mrs. Ben Firby, Ruth Meagher, all of Portland, and Catherine Meagher, Eugene; the residue to Mrs. Meagher and granddaughters.

Age Limit Boost May Be Necessary To Meet Draft Call

WASHINGTON, Aug. 19.—(AP)—A new draft plan based on liberalized deferment policies is in the making, selective service officials disclosed.

One of them told a reporter that the latest estimates indicate the draft can produce only 155,000 men 19-29 years of age by next March 31 "even if the bottom of the barrel is scraped." Maj. Gen. Willard S. Paul, director of personnel, has said the Army needs 185,000.

Liberalized rules would make even fewer than 155,000 men available. About the only way to increase the number substantially would be to raise the age limit above 29 years, one selective service official said.

He added, however, that this is for the Army to decide. The war department specified a few weeks ago it wanted its men under 29. The law permits the drafting of men up to 44. In addition 18-year-olds must register but are not subject to call.

Some announcement concerning new deferment policies is expected next week, one official said. Nothing is expected to be done for some time to increase the number of men subject to call as the present supply is sufficient for months.

The recalculations of manpower, based on liberalized draft rules, were ordered on the heels of protests from education and science organizations that the proposed rules will permit the drafting of some of the "most promising" young scientists of the country.

In addition the American council on education estimated recently 8,000 professors could be drafted if present rules are rigidly enforced. This, the council estimated, would eliminate educational opportunities for 168,000 war veterans.

Oregon Reach \$15 Million Loans to Veterans in

PORTLAND, Aug. 18.—(AP)—Oregon veterans have borrowed \$15,000,000 under the GI Bill of Rights, and new requests are arriving at the rate of 150 daily, the Veterans Administration reported today.

Loans have gone to 3,679 veterans. Nearly 3,000 loans were for homes, averaging \$4,776 each.

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
