MISS THORESON GIVES TIPS ON SEWING

A strip of tape sewed under a row of buttons—especially on this material—will go far toward preventing buttons from tearing out of the fabric says Wanda Thoreson, Home Demonstration Agent. The tape is sewed down on both sides on the under side of the garment, and the buttons sewed through the center of it.

This does not show when buttoned, and the strain is distributed so that the cloth beneath the button does not take the full pull.

On rayon clothes, such a tape will prevent the damage that comes from using an iron that is too hot. This tape is especially good on children's clothes or clothes that receive hard wear. It is worthwhile to apply tape to ready-made garments as well as those made at home.
