Crop Insurance Carries Low Cost

"Cost of production" insurance can be obtained at a very low cost under the Federal Crop Insurance plan for 1947 wheat crops, Douglas County wheat growers are informed by John H. Ferguson, chairman of the county agricultural conservation committee. Through this plan Mr. Ferguson explained, operators are guaranteed the return of their investment in the crop, no matter what happens to the wheat, for a premium cost of only a few pounds of wheat to the acre. Most county farms, in fact, would need to have a loss only once every 12 years to recover all of the premiums paid in that period, he declared.

Other levels of coverage, up to 75 per cent of the farm's long-time average yield, are available to farmers in the crop insurance contracts now being offered on the 1947 wheat crop. Mr. Ferguson said that farmers may call at the county office for information about the several plans, so that each farmer may select the coverage best suited to his needs. He reminded that September 28 is the closing date for 1947 winter wheat insurance, and applications will need to be signed before that date and before the crop is seeded.

American Woman Will Teach Jap Crown Prince

NEW LONDON, N. H., Aug. 27.—(P)—The crown prince of Japan is going to learn about Washington and Longfellow and something about American thoughts and ideals—with emphasis on a world at peace. These subjects will be the basis of the English-language course of the 12-year-old heir to the Japanese throne under the tutelage of Mrs. Elizabeth Gray Vinling. The Philadelphia widow, author of children's books, was happy today, but somewhat astonished, by her selection by the State Department to serve as a tutor for the crown prince.

Cardinals Wrest League Lead From Brooklyn Dodgers

(By the Associated Press) Murry Dickson, once an obscure bullpen worker but now one of the top pitchers in the league, is the most important single reason why the St. Louis Cardinals have wrested the National League lead from the Brooklyn Dodgers.

Overlooked in early season when Manager Eddie Dyer still had Max Lanier and Rookie Fred Martin to take their regular turns, Dickson turned back the troublesome Dodgers three times, including last night's 2-1 victory that restored the Red Birds to first place by a full game, in piling up an impressive 12-4 record. Chicago's Cubs shut out New York, 3, to remain nine games off the pace.

Pittsburgh put a crimp in Boston's third place ambitions with a 3-2 victory that left the Braves five lengths back of the Cubs. Elbie Fletcher's double with the bases loaded in the ninth provided the winning margin.

Dick Mauney of the Phillies blanked Cincinnati, 5-0, on four hits.

Boxing Climbs Continues In the American League, Boston calmly continued to eliminate clubs by walloping the Tigers, 10-6, on a seven-run eighth inning. Clarence Marshall, who threw only one ball, received credit for the win over Reliever Stubby Overmire.

Early Wynn notched his fifth victory in seven starts for Washington since he received his Army discharge, trimming the St. Louis Browns, 5-2, with six hits. Dick Fowler turned in another fine pitching job for Philadelphia, shutting out Chicago, 3-0, with eight singles.

Jewish Village Rounded Up for Ship Saboteurs

SEDOT YAM, Palestine, Aug. 26.—(P)—Two hundred residents of this tiny Jewish fishing village were rounded up by British troops and Palestine police this morning in a move said by officers to be directed at finding the "frog men" who almost succeeded in sinking the immigrant transport Empire Rival in Haifa harbor last week.

The village was surrounded by a brigade unit before dawn and the villagers were herded into barbed wire enclosures for questioning by police while army crews searched homes and buildings. Mine detector equipment and dogs formerly used for mine detection in Germany were used in the search.

Guenther, Pittsburgh, grand secretary, and William Wetherald, Zanesville, Ohio, grand treasurer. The 48th annual convention ended after the elections.

Judge Joseph Mallory, Olympia, Wash., a Washington State supreme court justice, and A. C. Friesen, Salem, Ore., were named to a memorial fund committee to supervise the distribution of \$2,500,000 for charitable purposes in honor of veterans of all wars.

Twin Defendants Too Much for Complainant

CHICAGO, Aug. 27.—(P)—James Cliff, 17, was the complaining witness in Boys Court yesterday against two brothers, identical twins, charged with assault and battery.

Cliff told Judge Joseph J. Drucker that either Peter or Jerry Renner, 17, blocked his way as he walked along a south side street and ordered him to cross the street. He refused, he said, and was badly beaten.

Cliff told Judge Drucker he was unable to say which of the broth-

ers struck him. And both of the twins denied having hit Cliff. Judge Drucker informed Cliff prosecution was impossible unless he could identify his assailant and dismissed the charges.
