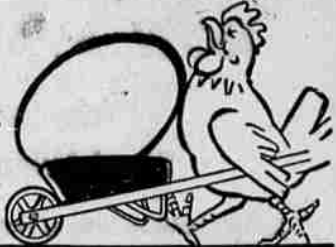

Australian Hurts Lie at Russia in Hot Peace Session

PARIS, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Australian Delegate J. A. Beasley brought delegates at the Paris peace conference to their feet today with a blistering attack in which he accused Russia of "lies," "intimidation" and "power politics."

But the burst of hard boiled oratory ended amicably and the Australian and his antagonist, Andrei Vishinsky, Soviet deputy foreign minister, left the room smiling to one another.

Beasley began his outburst by exclaiming at Vishinsky "All right now, you've had a lot to say, and I'm going to have my say too."

He came to the defense of Col. W. R. Hodgson of Australia, whose arguments before the Italian treaty economic commission, had been belittled by Vishinsky.

"Russia's tactics of thrusting their speeches down the throats of those who oppose them... is getting unbearable," Beasley said. "Freedom from fear does not exist in the world today," Beasley told the representatives of 21 nations assembled to make a peace.

"Fear is abroad in Europe, which is a sorry place after this war, and this fear is enhanced by the Russian tactics of thrusting their speeches down the throats of those who oppose them. We refuse to be intimidated."

"There is a lot of lying going on in the case of many of these questions. The peace of Europe is as important to us as to anybody else."

Red's Remarks Stings
Beasley appeared aroused especially by a remark Vishinsky made earlier that "Australia is the farthest point from Europe and has presented 35 per cent of the proposals to this conference," Beasley retorted.

"We may be 15,000 miles away from Europe, but we fought in two wars in Europe and have lost some of our best men here. We refuse to recognize that Soviet Russia has any more rights than we. We are not going to be intimidated because one power feels it is big at the moment."

Hodgson had moved to name a permanent subcommittee to investigate Italian frontier disputes and Vishinsky attacked the plan with vigor. He accused Australia of "delaying tactics" and asserted that the plan was "put forward to destroy the work of the foreign ministers."

In another phase of the peace conference, Czechoslovakia defended before the Balkan commission Russia's demand for \$300,000,000 reparations from Romania.

Russians Just Laugh
During the Australian's speech, the Russian delegation gathered around Vishinsky and laughed together while Beasley was speaking.

"The Russians seem to feel

that nobody is representing his people unless he falls into line with what Mr. Vishinsky says," Beasley remarked. "To hear him you would think that the Communist newspapers throughout the world were the only representative organs. Well, in Australia, nobody reads the Communist newspaper and I represent the people of Australia."

"This kind of Soviet tactics is getting unbearable. I refuse to be bounded around or bullied by anybody. We have equal rights with the reds to put through as many amendments as we want to."

Next War Will Start in North, Canadian Says

EDMONTON, Alta., Aug. 27.—(CP)—The number one problem in defending the North American continent from a northern attack is to hold securely the vast sub-Arctic airfield system and to keep the Alaska Highway open, Maj. Gen. F. F. Worthington said here yesterday.

"We are not pointing a finger at any nation or at every nation," Gen. Worthington said. "But we have to consider if an enemy exists, just where he would come in and why and how to meet him."

Later he commented: "It is well for you to know this north country, for it is where the hostilities will take place."

Part of Building Control Transferred to Wyatt

WASHINGTON, Aug. 27.—(AP)—Civilian Production Administrator John D. Small today announced he will transfer control over all non-residential construction, except industrial, to Housing Expeditor Wilson W. Wyatt.

Pending the transfer over a period of weeks, Small said that office, store, factory and other non-housing construction will be cut from \$45,000,000 a week to \$35,000,000. The aim is to channel more materials into veterans' homes.

This will lead off a "whole series of steps" to get dwellings now under construction finished before winter, Small told reporters.
