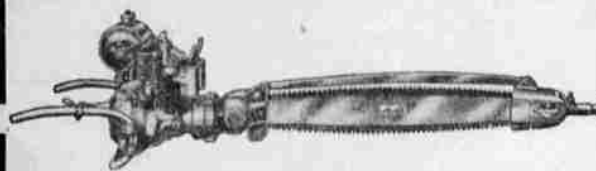

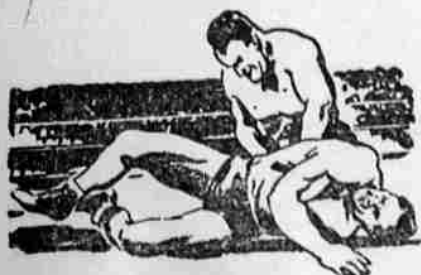

Pete Belcastro vs. Jack Kiser

Roseburg Armory, Saturday, Aug. 31, 8:30 P. M.

Kiser, Belcastro To Battle on Next Mat Card Here

Pete Belcastro, the tough Italian from Weed, Cal., who possesses the most deadly pair of dukes in the wrestling profession, will make one of his infrequent appearances at the Roseburg Armory Saturday night. Belcastro, who only upon occasion leaves his machine shop for anything but hunting or fishing, will take on Jack Kiser in the semi-final match of Don Owen's weekly card.

The Belcastro-Kiser skirmish is certain to be packed with dynamite and to match the haymakers tossed by the "Walloping Wop from Weed," the former coast light-heavyweight will have to be on the beam. Kiser, who boasts one of the finest physiques in the sport, is agile and fleet-footed and possesses one of the most difficult holds to break in the business "skin the cat."

Although Belcastro and Kiser are expected to attract great interest in their brawl, the headline attraction will be of much greater importance. The top-billed bout

will match Karl Gray against Tex Hager, the winner assured of a title tilt against Georges Dusette, Pacific coast junior light-heavyweight champ.

Hager, who hasn't lost a match in Oregon since appearing before crowds of 10,000 in Chicago and while amassing an enviable record in a tour of the mid-west, protested Gray's claim to the No. 1 challenger role after his victory in the "Umpqua Traveling Tourney Trophy" event here last Saturday. Hager, the popular and dynamic little matman, won his point and will wrestle Gray for the right to meet Dusette for his coveted crown.

Although Gray depends greatly on an effective full-Nelson, the Minnesotan who held the world junior light-heavy title before serving in the Army, goes in for fists upon occasion. Hager has long established his prowess to combat the roughest and toughest grapplers in the game and local railbirds predict the Oregonian will take the nod over the ex-champ.

A three-round boxing exhibition, featuring local talent, will open the card at 8:30 P. M. Elton Owen will referee all three bouts.
