Enlistments in Marine Corps to Cease Sept. 30

Sergeant G. T. Buttery, recruiting officer for the U. S. Marine Corps, reports receipt of instructions that Marine Corps enlistments are to cease Sept. 30, according to present plans. Men desiring to enlist in that branch of the service will be able to enter for 3 or 4 years enlistment periods in aviation, or 2, 3, or 4 year general duty tours. After Sept. 30, by which time it is expected to reach the limit of 100,000 men, enlistments will be accepted only on a waiting list basis and tour of duty will be 4 years instead of optional as at present. Marine recruiters are at the Roseburg armory each Thursday.
