Farmers Pass Up Opportunity For Conservation Aid

Douglas County is not taking full advantage of the assistance available through the agricultural conservation program for improving its agricultural resources, John H. Ferguson, chairman of the county agricultural conservation association, revealed today. Despite the need for increased work to check erosion and depletion on county farmlands, as disclosed in a countywide survey of conservation needs last spring, indications now are that all of the funds allocated to the county for conservation practice payments to farmers will not be earned this year, Mr. Ferguson reported.

The county committee is asking each farmer to take stock of his conservation needs now and to apply to the committee for assistance in carrying out any additional practices that can be done this fall. Fall practices which the committee are encouraging include seeding permanent pasture, pasture improvement, seeding grass to establish permanent cover in waterways and gullies, and construction of drainage ditches.

There's still time to carry out many practices for improving grazing land, Mr. Ferguson pointed out. Assistance is available for range water developments to promote better distribution of livestock, including springs.

Idle Funds Go Elsewhere—At the same time the committee is asking operators who will not be able to perform all of the practices for which they received

approval on farm plans to turn in the balances now. This will enable the committee to reallocate the funds to other farms, and obtain more conservation with the funds available. Failure of many farmers to apply for and use the funds for more conservation work will result in transfer of unused funds to other counties, Mr. Ferguson said. The committee believes that this would be most unfortunate, in view of the great need for conservation work in this county.

Rent Control Clamped on Marion County, W. Salem

PORTLAND, Oct. 1.—(AP)—Rent control went into effect in Marion County and West Salem of Polk County today.

The Salem region was ordered placed under price control by the OEA after complaints of tenants and a survey of the area.
