Speaker Dated in Roseburg Assailed By Taxpayers Assn.

Dr. Robert H. Griffin, of Chula Vista, Calif., an associate editor of Reader's Digest, scheduled to address the Douglas County Teachers' Institute at Roseburg, Oct. 21, is under fire from the Oregon Taxpayers' Federation. Claude Buchanan, president of the federation, has wired the Reader's Digest demanding cancellation of Dr. Griffin's further appearances in Oregon, "so long as he continues to appear under auspices now sponsoring him and so long as he continues to make such loose statements that reflect with opprobrium on the Digest."

The Oregon Taxpayers' Federation is opposing all tax measures on the ballot to be voted November 5th, including the Basic School Bill, and it is claimed that Dr. Griffin has made veiled allusions to the "rigidly" manner in which Oregon is supporting its educational institutions.

Assertions Resented
The taxpayers' group claimed in a wire to Reader's Digest that Oregon was placed in the same class with some southern states, "backward" in support of public education. Denying this charge, Buchanan, in demanding a clarification or retraction of Dr. Griffin's statement, said that the National Education Association and the American Association of School Administrators, in an article in the San Francisco Call Bulletin, ranked Oregon fifth with other states "in quality and achievement of states' school programs."

Buchanan also said that Oregon's average salaries for 1943 were well above the national average and that the United States Commissioner of Education in the April American Magazine, rated Oregon with 11 other states as having the "best" school systems.

Wage Scales to Be Set By Union of Musicians

The Roseburg-Douglas County Musicians' Union will meet Tuesday at 8 P.M. at the Central Labor Council hall in the Pacific Building in Roseburg, acting local union president Paul Lund announced Saturday.

Business in order will include the voting on by-laws and the constitution for the local American Federation of Musicians organization, an election of permanent officers, the publishing of local music wage scales and prices, and the appointment of a business agent for establishing jobs for union members. Also union cards and contract forms will be issued to members.

Lund reports the newly formed union now numbers 60 in membership with several new applications awaiting vote which will be included in Tuesday evening's business session.

Stenog-Typist Exams Set For Civil Service Jobs

The second postwar examination for stenographer and typist positions in Washington, D. C., is announced by the Civil Service Commission. Generally, the starting salary will be \$1954 per year, but higher positions are open to those with ability and experience. Age limits are from 18 to 62 years. Complete information and application forms may be obtained from M. Doyle, secretary for the commission, at the Roseburg post office.

Fire Dept. Will Set New Mark In Alarm Responses

The Roseburg Fire Department will set a new record this year for the number of alarms answered, Fire Chief Glenn H. Taylor reported today. As of October 1, the number of alarms in the City of Roseburg totalled 75, which ordinarily is as many as are received in an entire year. In addition to fires within the city, the department has responded to 16 calls from the rural fire protection district, making a grand total of 19 alarms to October 1.

The fire loss already is ahead of last year, property destroyed or damaged by fire amounting to \$14,837 up to Oct. 1, as compared to \$9,297 for the entire year of 1945.

Twenty per cent of the alarms received by the fire department result from careless smokers, Taylor reports.

The department has been called to extinguish 20 grass fires, most of which are of incendiary origin.

An increase in the number of fires, Taylor said, is to be expected, due to the increase in population and congestion. Many homes are housing more people than can be safely accommodated.

dated. Because of these conditions, the fire chief said, special care should be given to prevent fires. All possible hazards should be removed and precautions taken against a fire being started by carelessness or neglect.

In these days of housing shortages the loss of a home by fire is a greater tragedy than in more normal times," Taylor said.
