Full Objectives Of Oregon Chest Drive Set Forth

The Oregon Chest drive for Roseburg and Douglas County will open October 16, City and County Committee Chairman Bob Franks and Leo Young said Saturday.

A continuation of the Oregon War Chest, this state-wide drive is primarily for the purpose of coordinating the raising of funds for seven Oregon child-caring agencies and the Oregon Mental Hygiene Society through local county committees and local Community Chests in the state.

With hopes of fulfilling the quota by October 31, Young reports this year's quota almost three times lower than that of 1944 due to the dropping of numerous war reliefs. The Douglas County quota this year totals \$3,600, of which Roseburg will take approximately 60 per cent, or \$3,360, a figure which was accepted by the local city committee.

While the total goal of the Oregon Chest for the campaign is \$392,835, this sum has been equitably allocated to all the counties. Portland will carry approximately 60 per cent of this because of the greater benefits received due to that being the location of most of the agencies' charity homes. Most counties are adding funds for purely local agencies such as Camp Fire groups, recreation departments, and other such community organizations, thus bringing about a federated campaign.

Local Benefits Lead
Stressing the fact that less than one per cent of locally raised funds will leave the state of Oregon, that being for the American Social Hygiene Association, Young stated that although the funds raised in Roseburg and Douglas County go to the Salem

administration for distribution, the majority of the benefits will be local. As an example, Young cited the fact that from the 1945 budget, 408,088 days of care were provided for Oregon children, 5238 days of which were for children of Douglas County.

The city drive, directed by Franks, will include canvassing a radius of six miles and will be covered by campaign workers beginning October 16. The county drive will also be conducted by campaign workers and various Granges and labor organizations throughout the county.

Agencies to Be Benefitted
The member agencies of the State Chest supported by the Red Feather drive include:

Seven state aided child caring agencies: Boys' and Girls' Aid Society, one of the oldest licensed child welfare agencies in Oregon; Catholic Charities Children's bureau which includes five incorporated child caring agencies located in Portland, Marylhurst and Beaverton; Children's Farm Home, 285-acre farm on the Albany-Corvallis highway; Oregon Protective Society which operates a nursery, girls' home, juvenile hospital and boarding home in Portland; Salvation Army's White Shield and Wemme Homes in Portland; Waverly Baby Home, Portland; Volunteers of America Mothers' and Children's Home which is a clearing house for families in distress

while adjusting themselves. Oregon Mental Hygiene Society, which is a state-wide agency working for a conservation of mental health, prevention of mental disorders and raising standards of care of the mentally ill.

American Social Hygiene Association, the only national agency in the Oregon state quota, which was founded in 1913 to foster and promote activities and programs which serve to protect the family and its young people

from the tragedies that grow out of the misuse of the sex instinct and misunderstanding of the role of sex in life.
