Furniture Owned by Landlord Subject to Tax

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 16. — (AP) — Furniture owned by the owner in rented dwellings is subject to property taxes, the state supreme court ruled yesterday in a 6-to-3 decision.

The suit was brought by A. C. Allen, Portland apartment house owner, who sought to enjoin Multnomah county from collecting taxes on furniture in his furnished apartments. Allen contended that the 1945 legislature's property tax exemption amendments were meant to exempt all household furniture. Circuit Judge Bain of Portland ruled that the legislature did not intend to exempt furniture which was used for commercial purposes.

The high court decision upheld Judge Bain's refusal to grant the injunction sought by Allen. Justice Rossman dissented, maintaining that all household furniture should be exempt.

Overloaded Truck Smashes Bridge, Evokes Warning

A warning to logging-truck drivers that those who ignore the load limits on county bridges will be prosecuted was issued today by County Judge D. N. Busenbark.

His warning followed an inspection by the county court of an old, covered bridge over Look-Inglass Creek, which crashed under the weight of a logging truck last week.

The bridge, which was built in 1907, had a posted load limit of three tons. The truck, which Judge Busenbark said was driven by R. B. Slagel of Prospect, had an estimated 60-ton load, including truck, trailer, and logs.

Logging trucks from the Look-Inglass area are directed over a route which avoided the old, covered bridge. Judge Busenbark said Slagel, who was new to the area, became mistaken in his directions and took his truck over the bridge.

Slagel's truck had just crossed the bridge and was on the farther approach when the 125-foot covered span crashed into the creek. The reach, connecting the truck and the trailer, twisted and broke the connection, throwing the trailer and logs into the creek with the bridge. But the truck, on the approach span, was saved.

Matter of payment for the bridge was referred to District Attorney H. A. Canaday, who may seek an adjustment from the insurance company which protected Slagel's truck. Judge Busenbark said the bridge cannot be replaced until next summer.

Prefabricated Aluminum Homes Stated for Vets

AKRON, O., Oct. 15. — (AP) — Plans for construction of prefabricated aluminum homes for sale to war veterans at costs ranging from \$5,000 to \$6,500 were announced today by officials of the Goodyear Aircraft Corp. here and the Taylorcraft Aviation Corp. of nearby Alliance.

"The program already is under way, but it will be several weeks before the first home rolls off

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our assembly line," a Goodyear official said.

The one-story buildings will include a kitchen, two bedrooms, a living room-dinette and a bathroom. A spokesman said priorities had been received on materials for 26 "experimental" homes.

O. K. Bell, vice president of Taylorcraft, predicted that the Alliance firm would produce 15,000 aluminum or steel houses in 1947.
