Winner Here To Meet 'Gray Mask' For Coast Title

Six of the most outstanding wrestlers currently active in the Northwest will engage in a tournament Saturday night at the Roseburg Armory to decide who shall meet the Gray Mask for the Pacific Coast light heavyweight championship.

The title was vacated by Bruno Angelo when he won the world light heavyweight title recently from Ernie Pilluso in Los Angeles. The Gray Mask won a six-man tourney last week and he will meet the winner of Saturday's tournament for the championship.

Most of the battles in the tourney will be familiar to local fans. Seasoned Northwest campaigners will be Jack Kizer, Billy McEun, Buck Davidson, and Bulldog Jackson. The roster will be completed by Sammy "The Baby" Cohen, sensational Jewish grappler from the Bronx, and Frankie Hart, hailed as the best matman to come out of Canada in the last 10 years. Hart hails from Saskatchewan and made a sensational Northwest debut last week in Eugene.

The tourney will start at 8:30 P. M. with three 20-minute first round matches. The wrestlers will draw for card positions and opponents. In the second round one man will draw a bye and the other two will battle it out in a semi-final match, leaving two finalists.

The match between the winner Saturday night and the Gray Mask will be held next week in Roseburg and the winner declared light heavyweight champion of the Pacific Coast.

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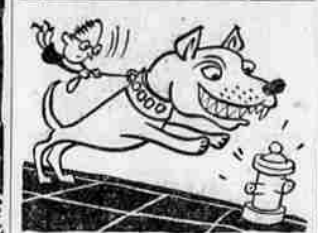
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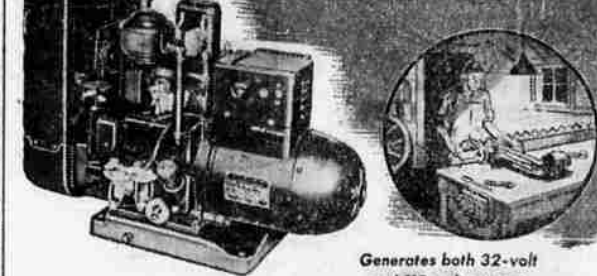
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
