 PORTLAND, Oct. 21. — (AP) — Eldon Glenn, 22, died in a hospital here last night several hours after being struck by a car. A woman walking with him suffered lesser injuries.
 Glenn's death brought Portland's traffic toll this year to 39.

Papooses Score 33-0 Victory Over Springfield Frosh

Opening their 1946 grid season with mid-season form, the Roseburg Junior High Papooses swamped the Springfield Miller "Frosh" 33-0 at Finlay Field Saturday afternoon.
 Following suit of their Senior High scoring Indians, H. H. "Hod" Turner's juniors even resorted to the third-string reserves as the visiting Springfield eleven failed to clear up the rain-soaked turf for a major threat toward the locals' goal line.
 The Papooses scored three touchdowns in the first half and eased up with a line-up of reserves in the last half to score two. Power-driving Stud Rodgers, following a series of center line plunges from the Springfield 40-yard line, drove through center the remaining two-yards and Parr made the conversion good on a repeated power plunge.
 In the second quarter, Matthews took a reverse from Parr and drove to the extreme left end zone to score standing up. Bonebrake intercepting a Miller pass at their 47-marker and dashing in and out brought touchdown number three as the half ended, Roseburg leading 19-0.
 Rodgers, off the Papooses' T-formation, opened the second half in driving to his opposing 45 and Bonebrake over off right tackle to twist and swivel to an open field and the end zone. Rodgers' drive through the Springfield freshmen was Newson, halfback, who performed all the punting to put Springfield out of immediate danger, attempted numerous passes, and did the major part of the ball toting.
 Papoose touchdown scoring was done by Rodgers, Matthews and Bonebrake, with successful conversions run by Parr and Rodgers.
 With Dale Blanck and Frankie Webber Coach Turner's only returning 1945 gridsters, the entire Papoose squad saw action in the pouring rain contest Saturday.
 Next Weekend the locals travel to Medford to meet the strong Junior Tigers and face Grants Pass juniors here October 31.

ment specifically, however, on a pending General Motors request for an additional price boost similar to that granted the Ford Motor Company some weeks ago under terms of a hardship provision of the new OPA act.
 The Ford increase amounted to about six per cent and was in addition to the general hikes granted to offset higher raw material costs and to restore normal profit margins to dealers.
Controls Will Hold
 OPA has refused to say exactly how much of a boost GM has asked, although the figure of \$100 a car has been mentioned by company executives at Detroit.
 Officials have stressed that automobiles, along with building materials and other similarly scarce items, are to be exempt from the administration's November 1 goal of getting rid of most price controls.

with the fact that an American party was molested at all in this city where there is free travel between the occupied zones.
 Flory, 28, was a civilian executive in the AMG. He was killed Sunday when he failed to follow orders to proceed to Russian headquarters after a Russian major and a military policeman had halted him and his companions—two American women and a German chauffeur—on a picture-taking jeep ride.
 Flory was struck in the back by a bullet as a policeman fired at his speeding jeep. The CID agents said. The women were not injured.
 American Army officials, investigating the triple bombings in the Stuttgart area Saturday, disclosed today that "about 10" German army caches were seized over the weekend in widespread searches in Southern Germany.
 The officials said, however, the seizures were not connected with the Stuttgart bombings.
