COMMUNITY CONCERT ASSOCIATION MEMBERSHIP DRIVE TO BEGIN NOV. 4

For one week in the year only, the Roseburg Community Concert Association sponsors a membership drive and the 1946-47 drive has been set for November 4 and will close November 9, at a workers dinner.

For the benefit of newcomers in the community who are not acquainted with the Community Concert Association, they are invited to call at the Chamber of Commerce headquarters during the week for their memberships if they are not personally contacted by one of the membership workers.

The Association is open to all persons interested in good music. World famous artists are brought to Roseburg in concert and only persons holding yearly memberships are privileged to attend the entertainments as no tickets are ever sold for any one concert. At least three concerts are guaranteed the members annually, however, the Roseburg Association so far has managed to present four concerts annually. The membership card must be presented at every concert for admittance.

Artists, who have already gained international reputations as among the world's great musicians of the day, have been pre-

sented by the Roseburg Association, as well as a number of very young artists, who were heard here during their first years of concert touring and who, after only a few years, have become leading artists in their work. Among these young artists heard in Roseburg, is Walter Hautzig, pianist, who was heard here the first year of the Association and who is now booked all over the United States for concerts during the coming year and is acclaimed as one of the finest pianists of the time.

Miss Gladys H. Strong, who has been president of the organization, since its first successful year, has issued a most cordial invitation to all music lovers to become members of the Association and enjoy these fine concerts. Miss Helen Casey and Mrs. Charles A. Brand are in charge of the membership campaign. Mrs. Paul Helweg and Mrs. Maurice J. Newland will act as co-chairmen for the dinner to be held for the workers at the close of the campaign. Mrs. Paul Elliott is secretary of the Association and Mrs. Alva Lewis will be secretary at the Chamber of Commerce headquarters during the week's campaign for memberships. Ed Story, representative from Columbia Concerts Inc., will be in Roseburg during the week to assist with the drive.
