**N. Y. City Surrounded by Sugar; None for Eating**

NEW YORK, Oct. 25.—(AP)—New Yorkers found themselves surrounded by 100,000,000 pounds of sugar today but had virtually none for their tables. The raw sugar was aboard cargo ships tied up by the maritime strike, inability to get the raw material forced the last of the city's four major sugar refineries to close yesterday.

**Hanging Decried for Two Japanese Military Men**

SINGAPORE, Oct. 25.—(AP)—Lt. Gen. Harada, wartime commander in chief of Japanese forces in Java, and his chief staff intelligence officer, Lt. Col. Masugi, were sentenced by an Australian war crimes court today to be hanged. They were charged with ordering the execution of three Australian airmen forced down during wartime minelaying operations off Macassar.

SALEM, Ore., Oct. 25.—(AP)—A state employee cannot contribute to the state employee retirement fund on any salary over \$200 a month, regardless of whether the employee works for more than one state department, Attorney General Neuner ruled today.

**Own Gun Kills Hunter**

ELLENBURG, Wash., Oct. 26.—(AP)—The first fatal hunting accident of the 1946 season occurred in Kittitas County Thursday when Paul B. Ross, 94, war veteran and farmer, died from a chest wound incurred when his shotgun accidentally discharged.

MADRAS, Ore., Oct. 25.—(AP)—The largest deer bagged in this area to date is an eight-pointer, shot by Erwin Thornton, Pony Butte rancher. The buck dressed out at 249 pounds. The antlers measured 39 inches, tip to tip.

**Salem Landlords Not To Join in Freeze-Out**

SALEM, Oct. 25.—(AP)—Salem landlords will not join with landlords in some other cities in refusing to rent apartments as a protest to OPA rent ceilings, J. P. Ulrich, head of the Salem chapter of the National Home and Property Owners Association, said today.

He said the landlords would support the suit by Henry Koehler, Salem apartment house owner, to enjoin OPA from enforcing rent control in Marion county. Addressing a meeting of the Marion County Federated Veterans Council, Ulrich said Salem property owners are as shocked as the veterans about reports of exorbitant rents, but he said the solution is to get more housing. He added that additional housing cannot be obtained under present federal restrictions.

**U. S. Bans Photographing In Berlin's Red Zone**

BERLIN, Oct. 25.—(AP)—Personnel of the U. S. Army's Berlin district forces have been warned to "refrain from photographing any objects of military importance in the Russian sector of Berlin or the Russian zone of Germany."

This warning, published in the headquarters daily bulletin, follows the fatal shooting of Harry

Flory, Jr., a Nebraskan in the Soviet sector. He had been stopped for questioning by a Russian patrol while he and two companions were using their cameras.

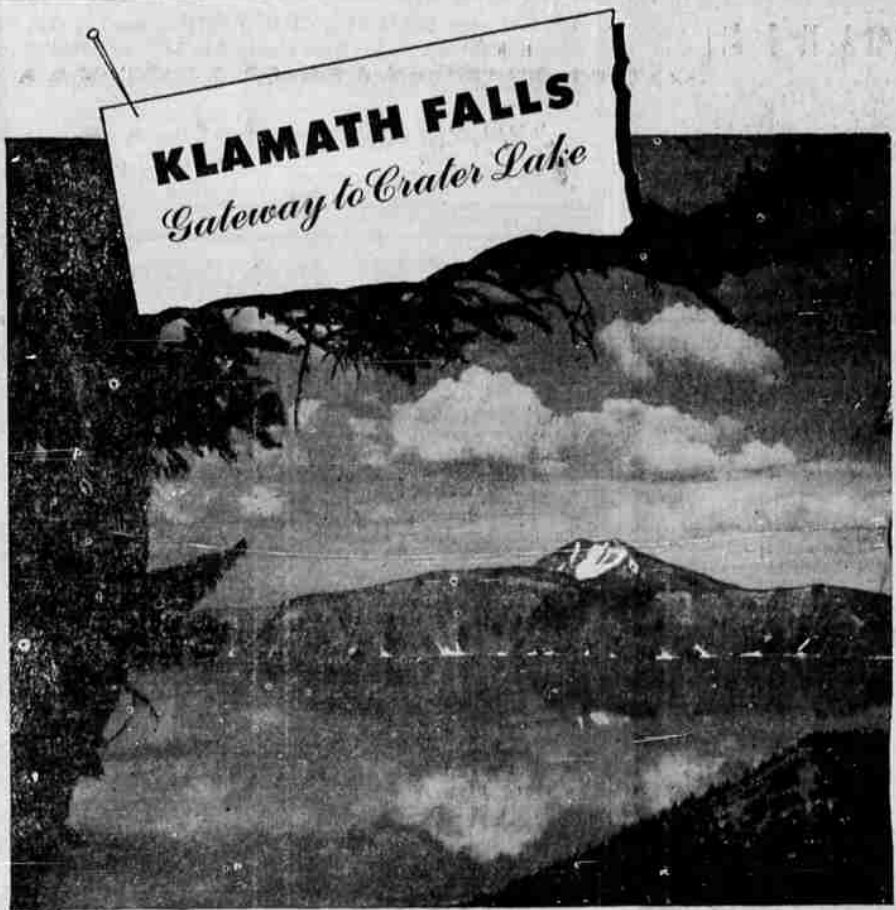
