

Handicaps Delay Road Improvement In Douglas County

Requests are made daily for road improvements throughout Douglas County which the county court has no hope of fulfilling for several months, said County Commissioner J. Ross Hutchinson this week, as he pointed out a news story in Pathfinder magazine which described the county's "fix."

"Three million miles of road roads will shame the United States for the next few years—a jagged, bumpy road on the nation's face," the magazine says. It continues:

"States never were in better shape for plans or funds. Federal grants are the largest ever—\$1.5 billion for a three-year face lifting. Revenues from gas and license taxes are 40 per cent higher than in 1940. Unused funds lie in state vaults."

"Congress ended the war emergency for road builders last December with a \$500 million a year grant to the states on a match basis for the next three years."

"A tidal wave of construction bids soon swamped the highway departments, but the Bureau of Public Roads (watchdog over federal funds) threw them out for being far too costly. The bureau ordered the states to screen out any bids 35 per cent more than 1940 levels. (Contracts today average 40 per cent above 1940 prices)."

Factors contributing to the difficulty in road maintenance, Hutchinson pointed out, are shortages in labor, equipment and materials. Graders, steam shovels, tractors, concrete mixers, trucks are in short supply.

The county's 536 miles of road and nearly 400 bridges—never designed for such heavy traffic as they receive today—are breaking down under constant lumber and log hauling. Approximately 700 miles of road in the county are used regularly for log traffic.

The county's gravel trucks are in constant use. When equipment needs repair, months elapse before replacement parts arrive. Trucks and motor graders are often laid up for want of new tires.

The county court sees little hope for an early easing of the situation, Hutchinson said, and asks the "cooperation and patience" of all citizens in the county's road maintenance program.
