Oregon Hospital Survey Budget Given Approval

PORTLAND, Nov. 4. — (AP) — The state advisory council has proposed a \$10,037 emergency budget to finance the Oregon hospital survey planned by the state board of health.

The advisory group of the board recommended a 1947-48 budget of \$32,032. A third of the sum would be supplied by the federal government.



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
