Would Strip Japs Of War Industry

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—(AP)—Japan would be stripped of all war industries, rubber, aluminum and magnesium plants under recommendations of Reparations Commissioner Edwin W. Pauley.

In a report to President Truman, Pauley also suggested "substantial removals" from 11 other industries. Among them were electric power, iron and steel, iron ore, copper, machine tools, chemicals, heavy electrical machinery, industrial explosives, communications equipment, railroad stock, shipbuilding and merchant shipping.

Pauley's report, made public by the White House, called this program one based on a "principle of severity combined with fairness." He recommended against reparations in the form of forced labor, from current stocks and materials on hand, or from stocks and bonds of commercial enterprises.
