Chairmen throughout the county expect to meet a November 25 deadline on mailing the seals, the sales of which give funds for public health work and aiding in stamping out tuberculosis.

Mrs. E. J. Loney, president of the county association, is being assisted throughout this week by women volunteers in sending out letters from the local office in the Pacific Building.

This year's Christmas seals, the 40th annual sale, carry a design of an old-fashioned lamplighter at his task of lighting street lamps.

The seal was designed from an idea contributed by Miss Mary Louise Estes of the Duval County Tuberculosis Association, Jacksonville, Fla. The artist is Lloyd Cox, who also created the 1938 Christmas seal.

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Clinic for Basketball Officials Dated Here

A basketball officials' clinic will be held at Roseburg Senior High School gymnasium Monday, November 25, at 7 P. M., for outlining examinations for Oregon State high school basketball officiating.

The clinic, under the direction of O. J. Monger, official examiner for this county, will be given for all officials and potential officials of Douglas County, for orientation of the "open-book" examination to be given at a later date.

Monger, appointed by Thomas Piggott, secretary of the Oregon High School Athletic Association, will be aided by John Newby, Roseburg basketball coach, and members of the local high school basketball team in demonstrating various floor rules and 1946-47 rule changes.

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
