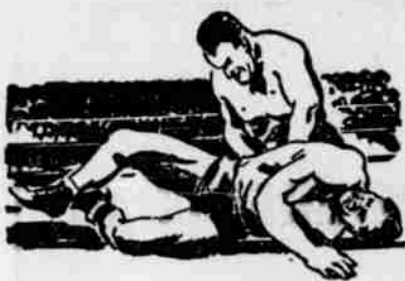

Logs Destroyed by Fire

PENDLETON, Ore., Nov. 19.—(AP)—Fire of undetermined origin last night destroyed logs valued at some \$8,000, Pendleton Lumber Company officials estimated today.

The blaze, fanned by a high wind, was confined to a pile of pine logs at the company's mill near here.

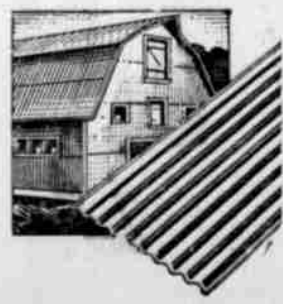
