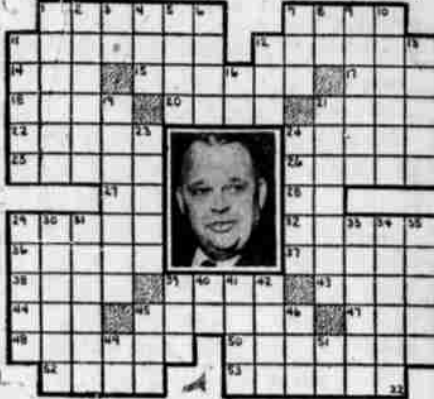

Cover dough in bowl and let rise in a warm place until light and double in bulk, about 1 hour. With a spoon or spatula, divide dough evenly between 2 greased 8-inch round layer cake pans. Then with floured fingers, pat out dough to fit pans. Mark each cake into 8 pie-shaped pieces by cutting through dough with a sharp knife.
