

Basketball Game Officials Required To Pass Exams

All persons officiating at high school basketball games this year, will be required to pass the State Athletic Association's examinations. O. J. Monger, official examiner for Douglas County, stated today.

Emphasizing the importance of the Monday, November 25, basketball officials' clinic at the Roseburg High School gymnasium, Monger pointed out that officials will be "flatly turned down" unless they show record of passing the examination, either here or before other official examiners.

Notices have been sent out to all high schools within the county that the basketball clinic will be held for officials and potential officials Monday evening at 7 o'clock.

R. H. S. Workouts For Basketball Positions Start

With 50 hoop potentials on hand at workouts this week—the largest basketball turnout in the history of Roseburg High School—Coach John Newby's Indian forces will vie against seven league opponents this year in the race for a state tournament berth.

Although squad "cuts" will be made, Newby states his hopefuls look very good in early practice sessions. Returning lettermen from the Indians' team of last year, which wound up in No. 2 place in the league last year, are Benson, center; Harvey, forward; Pope, guard; Piper, guard; McCown, guard, and Beard, forward.

This year's Indian schedule will call for games two and three nights a week, and Newby is stressing conditioning in early workouts.

The Eugene Axemen, winners of last year's district title, went on up the ladder to become state champions. Newby reports they have lost only two of their starters.

New opposition in District 6 this year are St. Mary's and El-

mira, both having outgrown the "B" league 150-student limit. Others on the list are Springfield, Cottage Grove, Junction City, and University High.

Newby reports the Indians' squad will consist of three teams, varsity, junior-varsity, and sophomores, all of which will play complete season schedules.

Open to all voting women of Douglas County, the meeting will be an introduction to the Women's League, which is affiliated with the National League of Women Voters. The league's membership participation and its general nature, in regard to public interest and policies, will be outlined. The league's organization, its various activities, both local and national, and its history, will be explained.

Dr. Landros stated in her last group session in Roseburg that the League of Women Voters exists for the political education

of women through their active participation in government. Membership is open to women who support the democratic theory of government, whatever their party affiliation. The organization is strictly non-partisan.

Chinese Regulars Prepare to Attack 'Commie' Capital

PEIPING, Nov. 21.—(AP)—Informed observers today predicted the government soon would launch an overall offensive against the Chinese Communist capital, Yanan, and other strongholds in North China and Manchuria.

Their speculation was prompted by Chiang Kai-Shek's order to government generals attending the Communist-shunned national

assembly at Nanking to return to their war zones immediately. Observers said the attack against Yanan probably would be only part of a general offensive which they expected would spread over Manchuria and North China, including Shantung, Hopei, Suiyuan, Chahar and Shansi provinces.

Communists charge the government has moved 100,000 troops into position to attack Yanan and daily have had reconnaissance planes over the city. They have evacuated women, children and hospital patients from Yanan and mobilized all able-bodied men and youths to defend the city.

Ideal fighting weather prevails now in North China, said military

observers, and the offensive could be expected to extend as far north as the outer Mongolian border.
