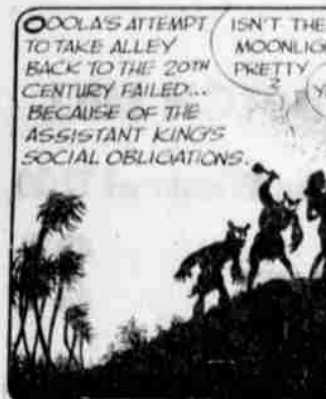
KEYSTONE CLUB HAS DELIGHTFUL MEETING AT DILLARD HOME
