Cordon Joins in Protest Against Radio Closures

WASHINGTON, Nov. 26.—(AP)—Northwestern senators today were planning to protest a decision of the Civil Aeronautics Administration closing seven airport radio stations. Senator-elect Henry Dworshak (R-Idaho) termed the CAA action "unfortunate . . . at a time when flying conditions are most hazardous." He told a reporter seven stations in the Northwestern area are being closed among them

Gooding, Idaho, and Ontario, Ore. An aide to Senator Cordon (R-Ore.) said the station at La Grande, Ore., also is included and that the senator was joining Dworshak in the protest.

"The senator feels," he said, "that there are plenty of places where CAA can save money without abandoning measures for protection of lives and property."
