Skating Rink at Armory Opened on Trial Schedule

A new recreational activity, a skating rink, went into operation last night at the Armory and will continue twice weekly for the general public, with a special Saturday morning period for youngsters for the next 90 days.

Handled by E. G. Erickson and E. J. Schweigart, formerly of Medford, more than \$3,000 worth of equipment in skates and sound system will be used in the new venture.

Erickson and Schweigart formerly operated a skating rink at Dallas, Ore. They stated that wholehearted support had been expressed by Roseburg school principals toward the skating rink to be open to the general public Monday and Friday evenings from 7 to 10 and to the youngsters at a special 15-cent rate on Saturday mornings from 9:45 to 11:45.

Negotiated through the City Park Commission for a trial period of 90 days, the Armory is being made available on a rental basis.

Harold J. Hickerson, speaking for the Park Commission, stated that recent attendance of the Teen-Age Club more than justifies the initial operating expense. All receipts collected by the Park Commission, he said, will go directly to the City Recreation fund.

The Junior Teen-Age Club, said to be averaging more than 100 in attendance weekly, will continue to meet at the Armory on Wednesday nights.

Northwest Tree Farms Receiving Seedling Supplies

The year's first fall shipment of seedlings from the Forest Industries Tree Nursery—50,000 baby Douglas firs bound for the Clackamas Tree Farm, of the Crown-Zellerbach Corporation in Oregon—was made Nov. 16, the joint committee on conservation reports.

This consignment, representing both the West Coast Lumberman's Association and the Pacific Northwest Loggers' Association, operates the industry nursery, located at Nisqually, Washington.

As shipments continue by the tens of thousands the Christmas-time planting program of timber and logging company cooperators is expected to be in full swing in a matter of weeks.

Another Oregon Christmas program is that of the C. D. Johnson Lumber Corporation, which will plant 100,000 Douglas firs on its Lincoln County Tree Farm before the holidays.

Scheduled for shipment November 20 to the Columbia County Tree Farms on lands formerly held by the Clark and Wilson Lumber Company were 100,000 Douglas fir and 30,000 Port Orford cedar seedlings.

The Weyerhaeuser Timber Company's Clemons Tree Farm in Grays Harbor County, Washington, is receiving 50,000 Douglas fir seedlings each week until the holidays.

"Also on November 15 the first weekly shipment of 35,000 Douglas fir seedlings for the South Olympic Tree Farm was made," reported Warren G. Tilton, West Coast Lumbermen's Association forest engineer. "The same number will be shipped to that Tree Farm each week until Christmas."

Farm each week until Christmas. They will be planted on the old Wynoochee-Clatsop burn, where big Douglas firs killed by fire in 1902 were salvaged by the Simpson Logging Company for 25 years.

"Experiments looking toward pulp timber for tomorrow are another item of special interest. On November 22 the Nisqually Nursery will ship 28,000 Noble fir seedlings and 20,000 of lowland white fir for planting on the Clatsop County Tree Farm."

"This represents the first commercial planting of these species in the West Coast region. Seventy thousand Port Orford cedar seedlings will also be shipped to the Clatsop area on the 22nd."

"On November 25 the Cathlamet Tree Farm will be shipped 100,000 Noble fir, 100,000 lowland white fir and 50,000 Port Orford cedar seedlings."

Tilton emphasized the distinction between "natural reforestation," which the industry plans for by leaving seed trees in logging and with other measures prescribed by law in both Oregon and Washington, and "artificial reforestation" through planting.

"The basic need for the industry's nursery comes from forest fires, mostly man-caused," Tilton said, "and we ask the public to be increasingly active in forest-fire prevention. Present forestry practices of the industry promise natural reforestation on 90 per cent of West Coast timberlands harvested each year. Artificial

reforestation will be necessary where forest fires burn off parent trees."

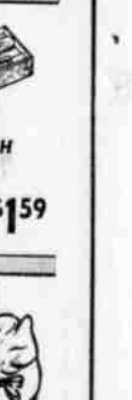
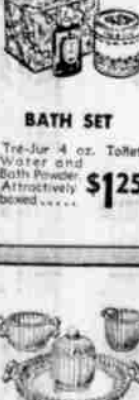
