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Christmas Seal
Idea of Danish
Postal Worker

Contrary to the belief of many persons, the Christmas Seal is not of American origin, but was born in Denmark, Mrs. Ralph L. Church, Douglas County seal chairman reminds.

Originated from an idea of Einar Holboell, Copenhagen postal clerk, who proposed each letter carry an additional penny stamp during the Christmas season for a fund to build hospitals for children, King Christian of Denmark authorized a seal for that purpose, bearing the likeness of the country's queen. More

During its early years the association cooperated with the American Red Cross in carrying on the seal sale and until 1919 the seal carried the symbol of the Red Cross. In 1919, there first appeared the double-barred cross, an adaptation of the Lorraine Cross, the official emblem of the tuberculosis associations.

Of contributions made from the Territory of Alaska, Hawaii, Puerto Rico, the Philippines and the United States, 95 per cent remains in the state where it is collected to aid in tuberculosis control work; 5 per cent goes to the National Tuberculosis Association, which carries on a medical research program and aids in many ways with the work in the various states.

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American Press
Given Warning of
Threat to Freedom

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 29.—(AP)—

The nation wartime director of censorship left a warning with American newspaper editors today of coming assaults against freedom of expression—"assaults of such character that press, radio, and screen inevitably will be drawn closer together in self-defense."

Addressing the annual conference of Associated Press managing editors, Byron Price, now board chairman of the Association of Motion Picture Producers, said a little censorship anywhere is a lingering threat to freedom of the press.

"No one can afford to feel smug and safe," asserted the former general news editor of the Associated Press, "when he considers the long term lesson of history and the gradual curtailment of liberty as regimentation advances with every generation."

Price said the motion picture business was growing up and appealed to editors not to be gullible about Hollywood and the old legends and clichés about the film capital. Better pictures, he said, depend upon better story material.

"It is not without significance," he pointed out, "that the level of our novels today is so low that the Pulitzer committee at its last meeting was unable to find a single one worthy of award."

Tax Pruning Predicted

Paul Miller, assistant general manager of the Associated Press and chief of its Washington bureau, predicted that Republicans will eliminate all controls, cut appropriations and some taxes, pass strike control legislation and trim or eliminate the State Department's \$19,000,000 information program throughout the world.

The AP will have a "larger and better staff" covering capital activities, Miller said, turning its efforts to more interpretative stories by experts who know their fields, and to clearer writing by all staff members.

Miguel Aleman Sworn in
As Mexico's President

MEXICO CITY, Dec. 2.—(AP)—

Miguel Aleman, Mexico's first strictly civilian president, took up the duties of his six-year term today, already on record for a "pacifist" policy in world affairs and "continental unity" in the western hemisphere.

The 43-year-old one-time lawyer, successor to a previously unbroken line of military men and temporary commanders and the country's second youngest chief executive, was sworn in yesterday before some 3,500 spectators, including delegates from the United States and 38 other countries.
