Attending the convocation of hotel men from throughout the state with Butler was J. A. Harding, operator of the Umpqua hotel.

A wide program of rehabilitation and modernization of hotels throughout the state also will get under way by the association shortly, it was indicated, Butler said, from reports of many members. Most of this work had been postponed during the war years, but a majority of the state's hotels have such plans ready to inaugurate.

Association president for the

coming year will be W. W. Chadwick of the Chadwick hotels in Salem.

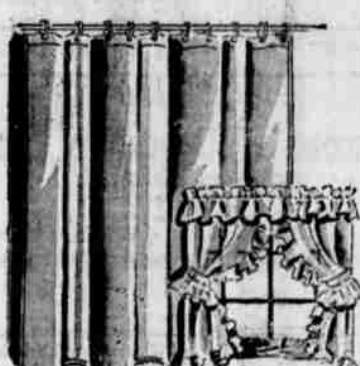

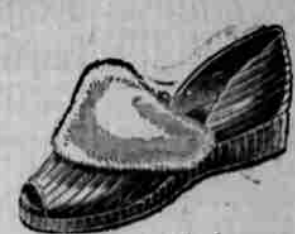

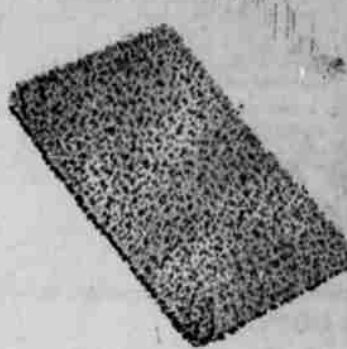
