Mrs. Broadhurst's Extradition Set

For Boise Hearing

BOISE, Idaho, Dec. 6. — (P) — A hearing on the removal of Mrs. Gladys Lincoln Broadhurst, 40, requested by acting Oregon Gov. Howard C. Belton in connection with the slaying of her husband, W. D. Broadhurst, has been set for Monday, Idaho Gov. Arnold Williams said today.

Authorities of Malheur county, Ore., seek to extradite the red haired widow from Caldwell to Vale, where she is charged with being accessory in the killing.

Mrs. Broadhurst has been removed from the Canyon county jail in Caldwell to a hospital where she is now under observation. Her attorney, Cleve Groome of Caldwell, announced earlier that she is an expectant mother.

Broadhurst, 51, was slain last Oct. 14 in the lonely sagebrush country of the Idaho-Oregon border. The couple was married last May. Mrs. Broadhurst's chauffeur, Alvin Lee Williams, 23, is held at Vale on first degree murder charges. District Attorney E. Otis Smith said Williams acknowledged he slugged the well-to-do rancher with a wrench and killed him with a shotgun.

U. S. Corn Slated For Japan, Korea

PORTLAND, Ore., Dec. 6. — (P) — Sixty thousand tons of mid-west corn will be brought to Pacific Northwest ports for shipment in a dual program to get grain to Japan and Korea and boxcars to the northwest.
