Counties Assn. Would Put Welfare Costs on State

PORTLAND, Dec. 12.—(AP)—A recommendation that the state take over the counties' share of public welfare expense was made by the Association of Oregon Counties at the annual convention yesterday.

The assembly of judges and commissioners also recommended placing all income producing property on the same basis as commercial enterprises for tax purposes. This would affect government-owned and charitable institutions property.

A constitutional amendment to allow political subdivisions to vote new tax bases also was urged.

Judge E. L. Pope, Oregon City, was elected to head the association. Other officers: Judge C. L. Allen, Bend, vice president; Marion County Commissioner Roy Rice, Salem, treasurer.

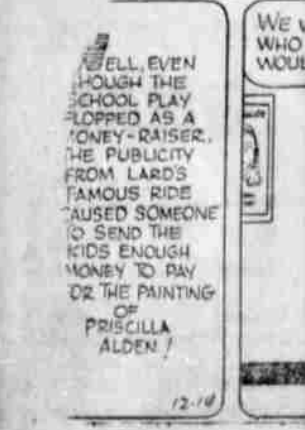
