Racial Tolerance Seen As Communism Barrier

SPOKANE, Dec. 19.—(AP)—Eric A. Johnston, president of the Motion Picture Association of America, said last night that increased racial tolerance in the Western democracies could rob communism of millions of prospective converts.

Speaking before the Chamber of Commerce, Johnston said the Western powers can "block Russia's territorial expansion by such means as the United Nations and block Russia's ideological expansion by increasing the contentment of those countries which lie in Russia's path."

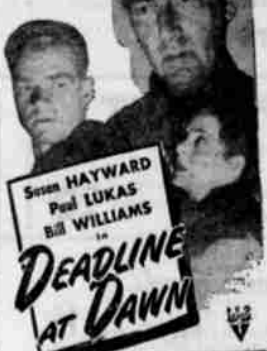
