Lessees of Fire-Swept Winecoff Hotel Indicted

ATLANTA, Dec. 24.—(AP)—A Fulton County grand jury investigating the disastrous Winecoff hotel fire, which claimed 119 lives, yesterday indicted the lessees of the hotel on three counts of involuntary manslaughter and accused them of operating a "fire trap."

Fulton County Solicitor E. E. Andrews said indictments were returned against A. F. Geale, Sr., and A. F. Geale, Jr., of Sheboygan, Wis., and R. E. O'Connell, Chicago detective, who have been operating the downtown hotel since 1934.
