Schools Congested by Increased Enrollments

Accompanied by Miss Florence Beardsley of the State Department of Education, Mrs. Lula C. Gorrell, county school superintendent, completed this week a tour of Douglas County districts which are suffering under increased school enrollments.

Miss Beardsley and Mrs. Gorrell visited schools at Dillard, Tenmile, Myrtle Creek and Riddle, where pupils attend in morning afternoon "shifts," due to limited accommodations. There is "no hope" of alleviating the conditions this year, Mrs. Gorrell said. Myrtle Creek recently returned to a single shift of classes, but only by converting a playshed and shop into extra

classrooms. Shop classes have been discontinued. Riddle's enrollment was expanded this year, with the increase of lumber operations in that area. Other schools suffered the increased attendance last year.

Wendell Wilkie's Estate Valued at \$849,000 Gross

NEW YORK, Dec. 27. (AP)—Wendell Wilkie left a gross estate of \$849,316.67 and a net estate of \$559,982.24 when he died Oct. 8, 1944, an appraisal filed with the State Transfer Tax Department showed.

The 1940 Republican presidential nominee left his personal effects and income from 75 percent of the residual estate to his widow, Mrs. Edith W. Wilkie, and 25 percent of the residue income and contingent remainder interests to his son, Philip. Among the assets listed by the administrators, the First National Bank of the City of New York, were stocks and bonds valued at \$448,624.12; mortgages, notes and cash amounting to \$116,912.72; insurance of \$139,847.16 and farm properties in Rush county, Indiana.
