

Oregon's Lumber Industry Headed For New Heights

At the close of one of the busiest years in Oregon's history, the lumber and logging industry expects in 1947 to reach new heights of sustained employment and production.

This was the consensus of bi-monthly reports from the employers of 62 per cent of the industry's 60,000 workers, as tabulated by the State Unemployment Compensation Commission.

Unless conditions change greatly, lumbering employment should reach 62,000 by May and pass the 1941 peak of 63,061 by summer, the reports indicated. Seasonal layoffs early in 1947 will depend somewhat on weather conditions but probably will be less than in pre-war years, employers agreed.

"Slight decreases during the late fall months in logging employment were offset by gain in sawmills, box factories and plywood and veneer mills," the report states. "The shortage of labor last summer was alleviated by layoffs from high elevation operations temporarily down because of snows. Production was slowed in some areas by shortages of logs and shipping facilities."

"No substantial change in overall employment is expected in January. Normal seasonal gains are indicated for March. Resumption of operations in the spring, however, will depend somewhat on the supply of available logs and other conditions."

About 12,000 veterans have returned to the lumbering industry, the report says. Although women quitting jobs are being replaced by men, about 4,000 of the "weaker sex" still are employed.

Bilking of GIs Charged To Dance Studio Manager

PORTLAND, Dec. 30.—(AP)—A dance studio manager was under indictment here today, accused of getting GI payments for nonexistent dance lessons.

Odd Hagen Foss, 32, manager of the Arthur Murray Studio here, was charged with fraud by the government. The complaint said he induced a veteran to apply for GI Bill of Rights payments for dance lessons.

The veteran had taken lessons before the studio was certified as a training school and was an instructor there at the time the application was made, the complaint said.

Foss is free on \$3000 bond. Hal King, Oakland, Calif., regional manager of the chain dance studios, said the Portland studio's franchise had been suspended, and the company would repay any amount in a defraud judgment.
