NEW YORK, Jan. 2. — (AP) — The New York Daily News said today that a movement to boom James A. Farley, former postmaster general, as President Truman's vice-presidential running mate in 1948 "will be openly launched at the Jefferson day dinner here, sometime in April."

"At the same time, a group of prominent, progressive business men will get behind Farley," the News said, adding: "Among them, it is expected, will be Baruch and Charles H. Silver, woolen executive and vice-president of the Alfred E. Smith Memorial Foundation." (Commenting on the story, Baruch told the Associated Press: "I don't know a thing about it and I am not having anything to do with politics." Farley declined comment.)

**Disguised Gun Shoots Divorcee; ex-Mate Sought**

NEW YORK, Jan. 2. — (AP) — Police posted a 24-hour guard today at the hospital room bedside of Mrs. Olga Rocco, victim of a Times Square subway station "camera" shooting, as they expanded their hunt for the Brooklyn housewife's ex-husband, Alphonse Rocco. The protection was provided, police said, because they feared another attempt on Mrs. Rocco's life might be made by the person who plotted Tuesday's shotgun assault.

Mrs. Rocco, who was injured critically when her right thigh was blasted by the full charge of a 12-gauge shotgun, has accused Rocco of hatching the scheme which led Pearl Lusk, 19, to shoot her, using a Christmas-wrapped shotgun she thought was a disguised camera.

Mrs. Rocco's condition remained critical today and hospital officials said it had not yet been decided whether to amputate her left leg.

## Martial Law For Holy Land Looms

LONDON, Jan. 2. — (AP) — A government source said today Britain was faced with the necessity of finding an immediate, final solution in Palestine or conducting a full-scale military operation to maintain her mandatory position in the Holy Land.

"Civility, the situation is out of hand," the source said. "And if Irgun Zvai Leumi carries out its threat (broadcast yesterday) to launch a new 'offensive' against Britain's armed forces, it may become necessary to proclaim martial law in certain parts of the country."

Martial law would suspend courts and civil administrations. JERUSALEM, Jan. 2. — (AP) — The threat of new violence hung over the Holy Land today as Irgun Zvai Leumi, rejecting an American congressman's plea for a truce, promised unremitting "warfare to achieve its goal of a free Palestine."
