

Naval Reserve Enlistments Hit High Tempo Here

David H. Hill, officer in charge, reports that enlistments in Naval Reserve and the electronic warfare unit now being formed in Roseburg, is "gaining ground faster than anticipated." Within the past few days, more than 30 applicants have been processed and are being sworn in as fast as papers are completed.

The Roseburg unit of the Naval Reserve will comprise an entire ship's company and will consist of all general service rates.

Special platoons of Sea Bees and Waves will be included. The entire program will revolve around the special Electronic Warfare Platoon, for which specialized training will be given. Training for other branches of the service will also be given locally. Advancements in all rates can be obtained as fast as in the regular fleet.

Major Points Cited

The "big talking point" for the Naval Reserve in Roseburg, Hill said, is the fact that no call to active duty can be given unless an actual emergency of national scope is declared. Another point of "vital interest" to all Navy veterans is the fact that enlistments can be terminated at any time.

Further longevity commences with enlistment and drill pay is authorized as soon as classes commence.

Full equipment for expert training will be installed here when the platoons are fully manned.

The Roseburg unit will comprise 175 enlisted men, 12 chief petty officers, and 13 commissioned officers, all recruited within a radius of 35 miles of Roseburg.

Training School Offered
Besides training and cruise privileges—none of which are mandatory—reservists are entitled to ships service privileges, commissary, canteen, and clothing allowances. Special advanced training schools may also be attended.

Enlistments will be taken every Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Saturday at the Army. Enlistments may also be made Thursdays at the Sutherlin city hall and Fridays at the Myrtle Creek city hall.

All Navy veterans are urged to see the free motion pictures of the Bikini Atom Bomb Test, to be shown at the Elks Temple Wednesday evening, January 8, at 8 o'clock sharp. "It's terrific!" Hill said.

A Navy dance at Kennedy's Dutch Mill, with an all-Navy Band from the 19th Fleet, is scheduled for January 17. "Many grand times are in store for Navy men here in Roseburg," Hill stated.

Roseburg Police Arrest 437 in '46; 139 Dogs Nabbed

City police made 437 arrests during 1946, an increase of 98 over the year before, Chief of Police Erwin Short reported to the city council Monday.

Motorists received 3,389 traffic tickets. There were 383 automobile accidents reported with 23 persons injured, including two fatalities. Police made 479 general investigations in addition to those of traffic mishaps.

There were 139 dogs impounded by Police Officer Douglas J. Tudor, city dog control officer. He disposed of 137 dogs. Ten complaints were signed against dog owners and one was dismissed. Seven dogs were released to their owners at \$1.50 each, costs.

Of the general arrests made by police, 237 were for drunkenness; 71, disorderly conduct; 13, vagrancy; 18, drunken driving; 63, reckless driving; 10, break-and-enter cases, and 19 juveniles. During December, police made 52 arrests, issued 680 traffic tickets, served 38 meals to prisoners in the city jail; investigated 44 automobile wrecks and made 35 other investigations.

Officer Tudor impounded 18 dogs during December, disposed of 16. Three dogs were claimed by their owners.

December's arrests were 35 for drunkenness; 5 for disorderly con-

duct; 2 for drunken driving; 10 for reckless driving.

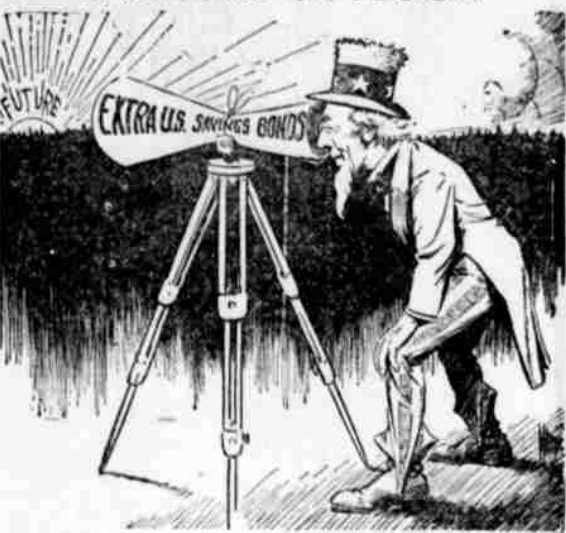
