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WRITE YOUR LEGISLATOR

As State Senator Thomas Parkinson was preparing to leave for Salem to attend the Forty-Fourth session of the Oregon State Legislature, he told a News-Review reporter that members of the county delegation earnestly solicited correspondence concerning proposed legislation.

Too many of us fail to realize the importance of our letters to our legislators both in the state legislature and in Congress. We elect these men as our representatives, but too often fail to let them know what we want, or give them the benefit of our views and opinions.

Do we oppose or approve a sales tax? The sales tax issue will be one of the principal topics for debate at the current session. Our legislators would like to know our opinions.

It does not require much effort to correspond with your representative. He does not need a long letter. A note on a penny postcard is sufficient.

Perhaps from your idea or theory your legislator can bring about an improvement in an important bill. He can do the job more effectively, in the way you think it should be done, if you give him the benefit of your thinking.

Our legislators need to know what people at home think about current issues. How they will be generally affected by proposed regulatory measures. How general welfare can be improved.

But our legislators want opinions on both sides of any question. They do not want "pressure" mail, except as it expresses actual views and opinions of individual writers.

That means that our system of freedom of enterprise and freedom of the individual must hereafter be COMPLETELY EFFICIENT. For, after all, whether communism or free enterprise will prevail throughout the greater part of the world will depend upon which is the most EFFICIENT.

Without making a definite recommendation as to the amount, he went on record as believing it will be necessary to increase the state's 3 cents a gallon gasoline tax and to up the taxes of other highway users.

He left to the legislature the matter of "how, when and in what order" highways are to be constructed and the question of reorganization of the highway commission and the motor vehicle department.

Warren said that after providing for maintenance, administration and other necessary operating costs, approximately \$27,000,000 of gasoline funds will be available during the next year for construction and reconstruction of state highways.

It is obviously insufficient (for either group) and there are cases in which \$14,000,000 could be wisely spent in one county alone and still fall short of providing adequate highways, he added.
