DISTORTING FACTS

Early last fall we were approached by representatives of the Oregon State Fish Commission who solicited our personal support for an authority bill proposed to be submitted by the commission to the state legislature.

Representatives of the recreational fishing group found the commission's proposed legislation to provide for all-inclusive powers. It would have reopened the Rogue River, nullified coastal streams regulations passed by the people of the state at the last election, and would have placed sports angling for salmon under the Fish Commission instead of the Game Commission.

Sportsmen insisted that no waters now closed to commercial fishing should be opened, and that no extension of commercial seasons should be permitted. The Fish Commission agreed to include these demands in its bill.

Believing that better management would result, should the Fish Commission be granted limited authority, we have personally attempted to cooperate with the commission and to draw some of our fellow members of the sports fishing fraternity into an effort to bring about more harmonious relationship between two factions which have battled furiously for many years.

There is little possibility of cooperation and harmony, however, if the Fish Commission, as a whole, adopts attitudes and distortion of fact as practiced by its chairman, John C. Veatch.

Many times in the past Mr. Veatch has, in interviews to the press and in prepared statements, attempted to place blame for decreasing fish life upon sports anglers. Therefore, it is consistent with his past declarations when, as the writer of two guest editorials in the Oregon Journal, he says:

Every legislature has had a fish fight at some time during its session. In these various contests, every interest except the fish interest has been represented. The point at issue has always been who gets the fish and when, and not what should be done to conserve the supply.

On the date of Saturday, Jan. 11, the Oregon State Game Commission held a meeting at Portland to set fishing seasons, bag limits, etc., for the year 1947. The auditorium was packed to its capacity. Sportsmen were present from every part of Oregon. Delegation after delegation appeared before the commission with its suggestions. But not one group asked permission to catch more fish. They proposed far more drastic regulations governing recreational fishing than the commission deemed necessary.

It would not appear from the Game Commission meeting that the sportsmen are attempting to hog all the fish as Chairman Veatch so deftly intimates.

Nor do we like Chairman Veatch's distortion of facts. In the second of his two articles he said:

Many sportsmen feel that the Fish Commission should not have the power to regulate the taking of salmon by hook and line. During the last season on the Umpqua River, 38 per cent of all salmon caught were taken by commercial gear and 62 per cent were taken by hook and line. So far as depleting the run is concerned, catching a salmon by hook and line has the same effect as catching one with commercial gear.

It is clever innuendo to point out that 62 per cent of the salmon catch on the Umpqua was by hook and line. Mr. Veatch meant his statement to include only spring Chinook salmon, for his figures are incorrect if Silverside salmon are included. We'll give him the benefit of an honest error in fact statement. But he did not point out that the 62 per cent of Chinook salmon taken on hook and line numbered 488 fish, and that the total catch—commercial and recreational—amounted to only 775 fish. Nor does he compare any of these figures with the record for 1935 when commercial fishermen took 110,551 pounds of Chinook salmon from the Umpqua River. Certainly THOSE figures do not substantiate Mr. Veatch's oft-repeated assertions that it is the angler who ruined our streams.

If the chairman of the Fish Commission is to continue his efforts to present the sportsmen as responsible for all depletion of fish life, there is little possibility he will secure their cooperation for his legislative program no matter how worthy it may be.

Coos Rivers Slated For Channel Deepening

WASHINGTON, Jan. 17.—(AP)—Plans to deepen the channels of the Coos, Millicoma and South Fork Rivers in Oregon today had the approval of the Army engineers.

Rep. Edisworth (R-Ore.) said the district engineer's recommendation, approved here, called for a channel 50 feet wide and five feet deep at mean low water from the mouth of the Coos to the head of navigation on the Millicoma and South Fork Rivers. The engineers said a three-foot depth would be sufficient, but that the extra two feet would be added.
