The Indians, who bowed low to Eugene's title contenders Friday, were slow in getting started against the visitors, but led throughout keeping victory never in doubt.

Greatly strengthened by Coach Jack Newby's rebuilding of the varsity and junior-varsity squads, especially with additional reserves Chuck Taylor and Jerry Coen, the Indians showed up well in all of their weaknesses displayed the previous night against Eugene. Also center Darvi Black seemingly hit his capable stride in taking advantage of his height on pivot shots passed up in previous contests to date.

Visitors Off on Free Tosses
Springfield, a hard-driving club, proved fights on the backboards and aggressiveness in all departments, but were off on free-throw shooting. Roseburg received the whistle 20 times while Springfield fouled for 19. Todd of the Millers left the contest on committed fouls as did Harvey and Scofield of the Indians.

Piper led the Indians in scoring with 14 points, followed by Benson's 12. Every member of the visiting club shared in scoring. Barge, forward, leading with six.

Jayvees Badly Maulled
In the junior-varsity tussel that followed the main event, the Miller Bees fairly slaughtered a helpless, non-clicking Warrior club for the locals' second loss of the season.

Unable to find their shooting-eyes, the Roseburg crew was weakened considerably by the graduation of former squad members to the varsity, and trailed Springfield through four quarters 6-4, 10-4, 22-5, and 25-11.

Feldkamp and Hubbard were the only standouts of the Warriors, while Hultstad led the way for the visiting victors.

Tragedies Claim 8 in Washington

Eight persons met violent deaths in Washington State Sunday, including a father and his three-month-old son who were burned fatally in their Seattle home.

In addition to the two fire deaths, three persons were killed in traffic accidents, one in an air crash and one when struck by a train. Cause of the eighth death has not been determined.

Fatally burned in the Seattle blaze were Clifford Rowan, 34, and his son, Jimmy. Another child, Susan, 3, still is hospitalized with burns but is expected to recover.

Lois Mae McClure, 15, and her half-brother, Richard E. Meyers, 4, were killed south of Tacoma when the family car, driven by another half-brother, William H. McKay, 16, went out of control, climbed a bank, and flipped over on its back. McKay received only slight injuries.

A Walla Walla student pilot, Gordon Hart, 24, was killed when his plane went into a spin at 300 feet and crashed across the highway from his parents' home. His father was an eyewitness.

Floyd Arthur, 44, a Great Northern railroad section hand, was fatally injured when run over by an electric engine at the Skowish roundhouse, and Paul
