## Apprentices Seek Larger Council

Apprentice veterans of Roseburg voted at their Thursday night meeting at the courthouse to enlarge the present employer's council for more widespread interest.

Presided by Veterans Coordinator Frank France, the council of employers includes George Ware, Bob Franks and Hans Hansen.

Other business of the meeting included approving business firms in Sutherland and Myrtle Creek for veteran-on-the-job training through the local apprentice program.

Of the 120 veteran apprentices now working with this program in Roseburg, France stated that 20 are disabled.

France pointed out to the group that any veteran in this area wanting to take college correspondence courses, whether in connection with their present job or not, may make immediate applications by writing to the Veterans Administration at Medford, explicitly stating their choice of schools, the length of the courses, and reasons for taking the course under the G. I. Bill of Rights.
