39 War Veterans Among Personnel Of Legislature

SALEM, Ore., Jan. 22.—(AP)—Legislation for veterans is expected to get a sympathetic ear in this 44th session of the legislature because 39 of the 87 male legislators are veterans.

The list includes veterans of the Spanish-American War, World War I, and World War II. Rep. Harvey T. Bates, Portland, is the only Spanish-American War veteran in the legislature.

There are 12 veterans of the recent war, including three senators and nine representatives, plus one who served in the merchant marine.

Two of these, Sens. Allan G. Carson and Douglas McKay, Marion county's two senators, served in both World Wars.

Rep. John M. Bates, Portland, holds the Silver Star, Purple Heart and Croix de Guerre for service in the First Division in the First World War. He was in the merchant marine in World War II.

Sen. Orval Thompson, Albany, is the only other World War II veteran in the senate.

In the House, the World War II veterans include: Reps. Carl H. Francis, Dayton; Martin P. Gallagher, Ontario; John F. Ganter, Portland; Robert C. Gile, Roseburg; Donald E. Helsler, The Dalles; Herman P. Hendershott, Eugene; Earle Johnson, Corvallis; Frank J. Van Dyke, Medford; and Rudie Wilhelm, Jr., Portland.

Fifteen senators and 14 representatives served in World War I. The senate list includes Carson and McKay.

As would be expected, the military and veterans affairs committee of the house is headed by a veteran, Rep. J. O. Johnson, Portland, veteran of the First World War. The senate military committee also is headed by a veteran of World War I, Sen. Lee Patterson, Portland.

Portland Trio Admits Tossing Man Over Cliff

PORTLAND, Ore., Jan. 21.—(AP)—The battered body of a ship's captain was found today below a cliff in the fashionable West Side hills, and detectives said three men told a grisly tale of tossing the man, groaning, over the 50-foot drop.

The victim was Capt. Frank B. Tatum, 53, Billerica, Mass., master of the S. S. Edwin Abbey of the Shepard Steamship Co. Tatum had been missing a week, but his disappearance was reported to police only yesterday.

Detective Chief James Purcell said three men, taken into custody during a bizarre all-night investigation highlighted by a night club raid and arrest of its 30 occupants, led police to the ship master's body.

Purcell said the trio told this story: The 40-year-old owner of the night club, one of the three men booked on a charge of suspicion of murder, got into a fight with Tatum in the club a week ago, and thrust Tatum, injured, into a back room.

Late that night the club owner grew annoyed by Tatum's groans, and ordered two younger colleagues to "get him out of here." The two men, one 20 and the other 25, drove into the West Side hills and dumped Tatum, still groaning, over the 50-foot cliff.

Youth Bares Grime

Police, checking the report of Tatum's disappearance filed yesterday by the steamship company's agents, were led to the night club as the last place Tatum had been seen. On Jan. 14 he was noticed standing outside with R. J. Peterson, Grants Pass, Ore., his ship steward.

Investigating detectives learned that a 20-year-old youth who lived in the club had been wearing

Chicago-Born 'Spy' to Face Slav Firing Squad

BELGRADE, Jan. 22.—(AP)—A Yugoslav court last night sentenced Chicago-born Ivan Pintar to be shot on charges of espionage and "being in the service of representatives of international reaction." Three Yugoslav citizens also received death sentences.

Summing up the case against Pintar, the court found that in the spring of 1946 he had "joined with the Ustachi terrorist group headed by Seipan Krovishich (one of the accused) who was also sentenced to death) and promised him he would do his utmost that the Ustachi would get arms, food and other material by plane."

U. S. Claims Board Eyes Vatican Property Ruin

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While the Vatican listed property damage at approximately 170,000,000 lire, the tiny republic in East-Central Italy petitioned for unspecified "relier" from "woeful damages to the republic of San Marino."

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Vatican claim was computed on the former official rate of 100 to the dollar or the current rate of 225. At the former rate the total damage—if paid—would amount to \$1,700,000. At the new value it would be \$755,550.
